Board of Christian Education: Jerry Lovell

The following report was sent by Jerry Lovell: Confirmation trip to Civil Rights Museum was a great experience. "UCC: Who We Are" Sunday School has begun. Donation sheets for the church picnic (June 10th) will be in Sunday school and the narthex. VBS on June 17-21 at Second Reformed UCC is being advertised. Graduation Sunday is June 3rd. Church trip to the Winston-Salem Dash game is June 3rd. No Sunday school classes will be held June 17th - July 29th. Worship begins at 10am in the chapel.

Financial Report: Denise Durham

Average weekly offering in the month of April was \$4,155.

Mid-year giving statements will be mailed out in July as a reminder of amount pledged versus what has been given through June.

Property Committee: John Smith

Allen Miller will begin to paint the sanctuary starting in June. The color will remain the same. Mr. Miller is exploring ways to clean columns and arches. New railing at the side entrance to the sanctuary has been installed. They are discussing ways to add more lighting at the pulpit and choir loft.

The Finance Committee wishes to report that pledges and offering donations are running behind the financial needs of the church. To meet expenses we need a weekly offering of \$5,099. Our weekly May average was \$3,044. We are behind approximately 25% in our year-to-date financial need. We encourage you to consider all the wonderful missions your contributions support and give as you are able. The seeds from your offering can yield a great harvest, "thirty and sixty and a hundredfold" (Mark 4:20). This is a vision where you will find fruitfulness, a vision that is "fruitful". You will be rewarded.

The Welcoming Team finalized their draft for the Welcoming Statement for the church at their April 30th meeting. They also provided a tentative calendar for working through the process of approval.

New Business:

A new Funeral Policy including bereavement guidelines and funeral usher guidelines will be incorporated into the church manual. The Security Committee asked for consistory approval for an after-worship appreciation luncheon for ushers to give the church an opportunity to update them on new usher guidelines, incorporating the sanctuary security system and use of the life-saving AED systems located in the narthex and fellowship hall. A date is yet to be determined.

- Travel 3.5 miles, Hwy 47 East makes a sharp turn to the left (look for church picnic sign)
- After bearing left, travel 0.6 miles (still on Hwy 47 East).
- Turn left in front of Bethany United Methodist Church (look for church picnic sign).
- Travel 5.5 miles. The stone entrance to Wildcat is on the right.
- Turn into the entrance and drive ¾ mile to picnic area.

Community Garden Gets Two New Raised Metal Beds ~submitted by Edgar Miller

May has been another busy month in the First Reformed UCC Community Garden. Thanks to a grant from the Lexington Garden Club obtained by Sylvia Walser and Aurelia Smith, and the assistance of workers from Open Hands Ministry, the Garden now has two very large raised metal beds. Each bed holds around 75 cubic feet of soil. The U-shaped bed by the playground will be used for a pollinator garden with plants to attract bees, butterflies and other pollinators. The long bed by Dominos will be used for warm weather vegetables like peppers and eggplants. The Open Hands workers and church volunteers assembled and filled the beds on two Saturday workdays in May. A final



workday on May 26 was used to knock down the rye/clover crop and add soil to the corner bed to prepare for sweet potato planting in June. Plans are in the works to dig up the potatoes the kids planted on March 18 on Sunday, June 24. Please let Edgar Miller know if you'd like to volunteer in the Garden.

Wednesday, June 13, the Friendship Club members, along with grandchildren, other family and friends, will be going to the All-A-




Flutter Butterfly Farm in High Point. Tickets are \$7.00/person. We will leave from the church at 9:00 that


