Dear Beloved Community,

"WhooHoo! This place feels good!" Words said excitedly by a teenage boy Monday night in our Church Fellowship Hall at the Open Hands Meal. This young man lives in a house that has no air conditioning, only a small fan to circulate already warm air. He lives with a parent, yet he is responsible for getting himself from place to place. In the late afternoon on Monday, June 18 when the temp swarmed around 93 degrees, you as a congregation gave a tremendous gift to this young man and to so many like him who have no access to AC on these hot days. Not only did he receive a meal, but, I truly believe, the cool air he felt was a powerful symbol of the breeze of the Holy Spirit...of what grace feels like when life is tough and the odds are stacked against you. Thank you First Reformed for BEING THE CHURCH.

I have spent 2 days in Greensboro at the Annual Gathering of Southern Conference of the United Church of Christ held in Greensboro. Our conference, like the nation in general, is concerned about the issues of immigration, sexual violence, racial equity, the environment and so many other challenges. I took part in seminars and discussions on how the Church can help show love and compassion in

the midst of these difficult times. I also had rich conversations with other pastors whose congregations went through the *Building An Inclusive Church* process. I continue to believe this process is leading us in a healthy direction as we seek to further ourselves in God's mission. I believe we have a unique calling at First Reformed to help alleviate the suffering and pain that, unfortunately, so many have felt from traditional churches.

Conference delegates from our church were Patti and Jerry Lovell, who volunteered for the hospitality team who helped provide refreshments to those who attended. They can also provide other info about the meeting.

I want to say *Thank You* to Clifton Murphy for agreeing to serve on the Board of the Southern Conference. I know his wise spirit and calming presence will be a blessing to the Board as they continue to seek to discover how to better serve the churches in the Southern Conference.

As part of my call agreement with you, I receive 4 weeks vacation. I will be taking 2 of those beginning June 25. Rev. Dr. Lee Jessup will lead worship on July 1, and Rev. Larry Bolick will lead worship on July 8. Please support the church and

these ministers with your attendance. Rev. Mike Hooper and Rev. June Grubb will be On-Call should a pastoral emergency arise.

Summer blessings be upon you. Enjoy the warm weather as you are able, be reminded of God's spirit in all the summer goodness, reminding you that you will never walk alone.

This means that while reciting collective creeds and unison statements helps us communicate our faith and build community with one another, none of us are mandated or required to believe or recite any particular theological doctrine in order to be part of the Church. The class participants were asked to complete these sentences about faith as they felt led. Below is the beautiful Statement of Faith that was created. What would you add?

- ~is the good shepherd.
- ~is our great and consummate mentor.
- ~loves all people...period!
- ~is always with me and loves me unconditionally.

I believe that the Holy Spirit...

- ~is transformative to the person and world who accepts it.
- ~guides me (when I allow it!)
- ~is shown in every act of kindness we do.
- ~is always there for us.
- ~is our comforter and advocate.
- ~invades our souls and keeps us on the right track for Jesus.
- ~is within us, guides/leads us.
- ~surrounds us and comforts us.

I believe that the Church...

- ~is the collection of people seeking the previous statements.
- ~is a family of seekers with similar paths, not always agreeing but continually seeking.
- ~is a community of loving people seeking a closer walk with God.
- ~is the body of Christ made of huggers, seekers, and servants.
- ~is a reflection of what it does for the community.
- ~supports the growth of all its members.
- ~is a family of love and support that helps guide us as we seek to be more like Jesus and be better servants.
