

Clarence Jordan was a farmer, Baptist minister and biblical scholar who, in 1942, founded the interracial community of Koinonia in south Georgia. His perspective of Christian discipleship, particularly in regard to the issues of racial equality, war and greed, made him a highly controversial figure in his hometown of Americus and Sumter County, Georgia. Jordan's life and theology were a radical embodiment of the teachings of Jesus, especially those from the Sermon on the Mount. In 1968 he and Millard Fuller founded Fund for Humanity, which later became Habitat for Humanity International.





# "PLEASE, WON'T YOU BE MY NEIGHBOR?"

here used to be a program which aired on PBS; Mr. Roger's Neighborhood. Fred Rogers was a friendly, non-threatening-presence, who helped children, as well as adults, cope with things that they experienced in the world; many of which they found frightening. At the opening of each episode, he sang a little ditty, inviting all to be his neighbor, "It's a beautiful day in the neighborhood. It's a beautiful day for a neighbor. Would you be mine? Could you be mine?"

In similar fashion, Altadena Community Church in Altadena, CA wanted to know their neighbors better as well as tackle the sensitive subject matter of mental illness. So, in October 2017, they offered a free Mental Health First Aid Training for community leaders and first responders, sponsored in part with a Neighbors in Need Grant. 25 people registered.

The church's leadership wanted to raise the communities awareness of mental health with the hope of reducing the stigma associated with it. Issues of public safety were to be addressed; hence the leadership at Altadena Community Church believed that providing mental health first aid training could prove beneficial for all.

"Awareness of mental health as a justice issue has grown in the congregation", said Associate Pastor,

Kelli Parrish Lucas. Furthermore, she stated "there is a growing awareness in the church that there is need to distinguish between actual danger and acute mental health symptoms which some may perceive as potential dangers or something to fear. The Mental Health First Aid Trainings have prompted congregational awareness that there are safe ways to engage in situations that involve mental health crises." Many participating agreed.



One participant who attended the free two-half day training sessions had this to say about it, "Thank you so much for this training. I have already told others about it and I think it is a very essential training to do and partake in."

When asked whether the discussion on disability awareness and justice, added or detracted, from the topic of mental health, another attendee replied, "This was my favorite discussion. Because I deal with this on a daily basis, it was easy for me to provide my input on the subject. With relation to mental health, I think it was a good conversation to have."



# Finding My Field Galen Hahn





Toward the end of my life, I am enjoying the opportunity of revisiting some of my early days of involvement in ministry before ordained ministry became my life. I was early affected by race, poverty, justice, and ministry to children where these were issues. These issues have stayed with me throughout my ordained ministry.

Early in my community service, I leaned that people involved in service to those in need are not able to simply "go forth and do good deeds." Financial and political powers have, too often, become goals in and of themselves rather than a means to accomplish much good. That "early learning" prompted me to move in the direction of ordained parish ministry as my field of operation in life.

Finding My Field seeks to share a few of my migrant ministry experiences that helped me make these discoveries about real life.
