**Calm and Bright:
200 Years of
Silent Night**

This year is the 200th anniversary of the debut of the beloved Christmas Carol, "Silent Night, Holy Night." Many people say their favorite time of the season is on Christmas Eve when they light their white candle in the midst of the dark sanctuary, and sing this beloved song. Something mystical and sacred occurs as our small, solitary lights unite together in the darkness as we sing the hope of "all is calm, all is bright."

This classic hymn, "Silent Night," first made its debut on Christmas Eve 1818 at the St. Nicholas chapel in Oberndorf bei Salzburg, Austria. The melody by composer Franz Gruber is instantly recognizable from the first few notes, and the original text by Joseph Mohr has been translated from the original German into over 140 languages.

In 1914, just four years shy of the 100th anniversary of "Silent Night," the soldiers fighting World War I along the Western front held a ceasefire in some areas. Known as "The Christmas Truce," the sounds of rifles firing and shells exploding faded in a number of places as British, Belgian and French soldiers put down their rifles, stepped out of their trenches and spent Christmas mingling with their German enemies along the Western front. It was observed that members from opposing sides exchanged gifts and stories with one another, played games, and sang Christmas carols together, includ-

ing the beloved hymn "Silent Night."

Although this cease-fire was one of a kind never repeated with the same effect, it served as heartening proof, however brief, that beneath the brutal clash of weapons, the soldiers' essential humanity endured.

We need this kind of reminder today, that our humanity and identity as God's children - across this globe, is proof that we are bound together. We need a "Silent Night."

Our Advent worship will celebrate the carol's message and remind us of our call to be

doers of justice,
makers of peace,
and bearers of light.

- ◇ Average attendance for the month of October was 101

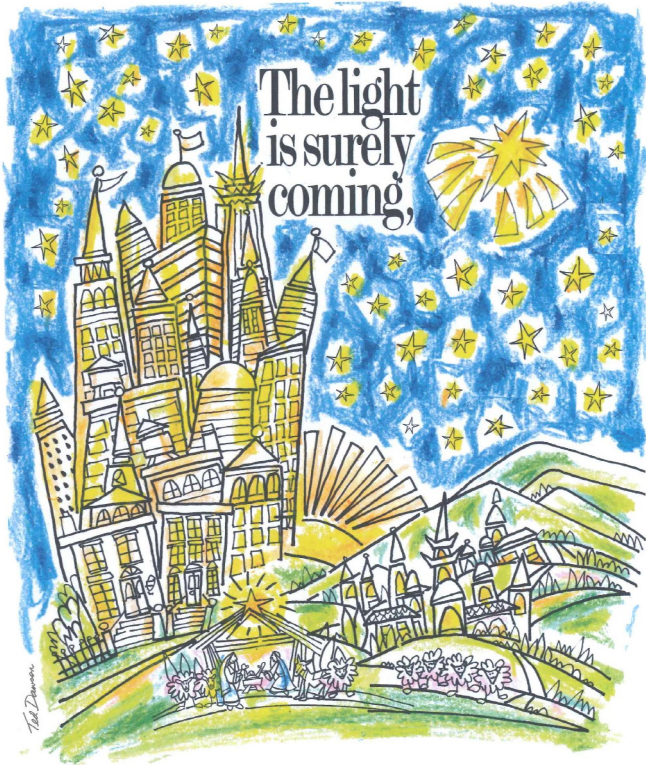
Old Business:

WORLD AIDS DAY

The East Lexington Collaborative Ministries (First Reformed UCC, Second UCC, Shady Side Presbyterian Church, and St. Stephen UMC) invites the community to a worship service in recognition of World Aids Day. **The worship service will be held at Files Chapel Baptist Church, 912 Dixie Street, Lexington, NC on December 1, 2018 at 7 pm.** The East Lexington Collaborative Ministries Group is grateful to Rev. John W. Cade, Files Chapel Baptist Church and its choir for sharing their sanctuary for this community worship service.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, World Aids Day is an opportunity to unite in our efforts to stop new HIV infections, support those affected by HIV, and remember those who lost their lives to HIV-related diseases.

In 2017, an estimated 36.7 million people are living with HIV worldwide. Since the peak of the epidemic in 2005, annual AIDS-related deaths have declined by 48%. In the US, an estimated 1.1 million people are living with HIV, and 1 in 7 take advantage of the lifesaving treatment that could keep them healthy and protect their partners.

Our guest speaker for this service will be Ms. Alicia Diggs, CEO and Founder of *I Will Live*. Ms. Diggs has a Bachelor's degree in Social Work, a Master's degree in Public Health, and is currently working on her PhD in Public Health. She became an HIV/AIDS Activist, Educator and Speaker in 2004. She is currently a board member of North Carolina AIDS Action Network, a member of the UNC Center for AIDS Research's Community Advisory Board, the Wake Forest Baptist Community Advisory Board and the National Community Advisory Board for the Women's Interagency HIV Study. She is a Medical Case Manager working with persons living with HIV. She became a published author in 2017 with an autobiography entitled "Standing on My Healing: From Tainted to Chosen".



Also speaking at this service will be Mrs. Sophia Hall, Executive Director of Positive Wellness Alliance, Inc. Positive Wellness Alliance is a community-based AIDS service organization serving Davidson, Davie, Forsyth, Iredell, Rowan, Stokes, Surry and Yadkin counties. The mission of Positive Wellness Alliance is to provide services and support to people living with and affected by HIV/AIDS through medical case management, housing, outreach and preventative education in the above counties.

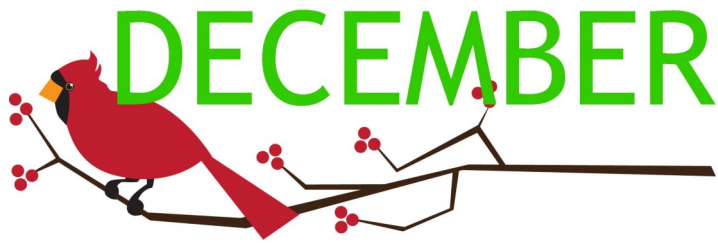

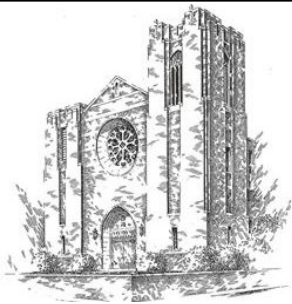
