After a bumpy start with the weather, we entered 2019 with energy and purpose. Ministries are developing and others deepening. Rev. June Grubb has cultivated a compassionate group of "visitors" who are willing to go and visit with some of our sick and homebound members. Our Teens class started with at least 5 each Sunday! Kivi Miller and Mike Price organized our first ever Intergenerational Game Night, and Susie Smith is coordinating another round of "BRIDGE" Groups this semester.

On Sunday, February 10th during worship we will celebrate our decision to become an Open and Affirming congregation. In 2017, the Building an Inclusive Church process began with the goal of intentionally welcoming and affirming persons regardless of their sexual orientation, gender identity or expression. As the congregation engaged in the hard, yet sometimes slow work of discernment, it became evident that embracing diversity in its many forms was important in the life of this church. Thus, the Welcoming Statement was adopted on October 1, 2018. This statement is listed on Page 2. I have found that it helps me strive to be intentional and, I hope, thoughtful about the way I communicate and envision ministry.

After worship, we gather for the Congregational Meeting. We will celebrate ministry highlights from 2018 and also look forward to what's next.

CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE JANUARY 2019 MEETING

Board Transitions

• Outgoing chairs to meet with incoming chairs to review goals of the board/committee. A file will be kept in the office with checklists/guidelines for each chair to ease the transition. Each board chair will follow up with the church staff concerning any approvals/updates following consistory meetings (i.e. items that need to be advertised, clerical needs, etc.).

Board of Spiritual Growth and Renewal: Lena Johnson (unable to attend but sent the following report later)

- Met with Cathy Waitman and Rev. Horton to discuss beginning plans for 2019
 - * 2019 Board members are in place
 - * New Sunday school classes include: 3 Classes for Youth and 2 Adult Classes, including the new Family and Faith Discussion Group
 - * Families First luncheon meeting January 20th to gather input on their children's religious development and expectations

Board of Congregational Life: Kivi Miller and Mike Price

- Concern in process of finalizing members of committee since so many church members are involved
- Sunday School Social Volunteers and Congregational Meal Setup/Cleanup Committees will be handled as the year progresses

Board of Business Management and Stewardship

- Financial Report: Lindsay Sink
- Average weekly offering in the month of December was \$6,349
- 2018 budgeted benevolences were paid in full in the month of December
- E-giving research has been narrowed to Vanco that works with the current software used by First Reformed for posting contributions. This process will allow church members and others who visit the church website the opportunity to donate using a debit/credit card or ACH processing. Lindsay requested this information go back to the Finance Committee for processing. (**NOTE:** The Finance Committee and Consistory held an e-vote January 15, 2019 approving a motion for the church to enter into a trial period (2019) commitment with Vanco as they would provide the most cost effective and easiest method for e-giving service.)

Property Committee: Eddie Yates

- A leak was reported in one of the upstairs classrooms but with no current issue with this area, Property will continue to check.
- Property is checking on replacing the folding doors that close the kitchen and storage area from the fellowship hall.
- We received a note from the city to check gas connections. Buddy Lohr has asked someone he knows to check this for the church who is willing to perform the work at no charge.
- Property will work on updating guidelines for use of church facilities.

Board of Community Outreach: Jerry Lovell

- Two new volunteers have been added to this committee
- Jerry is getting details on staying overnight at the Homeless Shelter and serving monthly meals
- "Touching Davidson County With Love" is April 13th. He will share more info as it becomes available.

Evangelism Board: Dave Fulton and Harriette Murphy

- Average attendance for December 2018: 119 (Snow Day December 9th)
- CPR Classes advertised in the Fall of 2018 will be offered at Second UCC on Saturday, March 23rd and Saturday, March 30th. The cost is \$25 and retired fireman, Dickie Green, is the instructor.
- A Community Meal will be held the 4th Tuesday in February. There is a suggested charge of \$5.00 per meal.
- Plans have been discussed for a fundraiser sometime in November of December with monies going to a nonprofit chosen by the Board of Evangelism. They are in discussion with Mike Price, who is part of a big band group of Salisbury, as the entertainment for this event.

Old Business:

- Annual staff reviews are planned in January.
- Property
 - * Review those regularly using church property: Open Hands, Sheets Dance, etc.
 - * Guidelines for maintenance
 - * Communications when problems arise
 - * Use of facility

New Business:

- A motion to accept reinstating Cynthia Crowell Little to full membership was made, seconded and approved.
- Current consistory members are asked to help with communion at church and with home communion for our homebound.
- The annual Congregational Meeting will be held Sunday, February 10th. We will celebrate our covenant. and 2018 Board Chairs will share the 5 top projects their boards/committees completed in 2018 and share visions/ goals for 2019.
- A Consistory Retreat was discussed for Sunday, March 3rd beginning at 4pm
- Dave Fulton shared Open Hands Ministry's need to combine the Wesley Heights meal group with the group meeting at First Reformed. If this does not exceed the fire code guidelines for our building more individuals would be added to help in serving a larger group.
- Dave shared revised prayer ministry guidelines for approval. The revision was approved.

The next Consistory meeting is scheduled for February 3, 2019.

Cold winter temps have finally arrived, but inside FRUCC there is warmth created from the new Sunday school classes and activities in which our members are involved. We started three new Sunday school classes in January one for Younger Children led by Lena Johnson, one for teens with Pastor Elizabeth and Jeremy Peterson, and a parents group discussion class facilitated by Jeremy Lovell. We have had great participation and hope to keep the energy flowing. In March, the parent discussion group will combine with the other adult class, now named Inquiring Minds, to study Rob Bell's book, "Love Wins," with Walter Hoffman. I want to thank our church family for the generous Christmas gift. I appreciate your thoughtfulness and want you to know what a special gift it is to work with all of

you. We have a tremendous church family who is always willing to support each other and our ministries.

The Youth Service Project, with special helpers Lena Johnson and Rita Lohr, was a

Valentine's surprise for our homebound members. The children made heart decorations to hang on a door or wall and a heart shaped "baggie" of candy. Although there were lots of red (paint), sticky (glue) hands, the children had fun making these



gifts! They will be delivered as visits are made to the homebound members. A future service project will be providing filled purses for homeless women. If you are cleaning out closets and have gently used purses you would like to donate, please bring them to the crates in the narthex or outside the office. Costume jewelry and toiletries such as combs, brushes, toothpaste, toothbrushes, lotion, etc. can also be donated. The children will "stuff" the purses which will be distributed through Open Hands and Crisis Ministries. Thanks to a suggestion from Camille Morgan, we are going to participate in a Heifer Project this spring. It is called "Llamas for Lent" and will begin in March. It will end with a oneday Vacation Bible School in June to celebrate our efforts. Youth will collect "silent" offerings once a month (March – June) and donations will go to Heifer to purchase a



llama and/or other animals. They will be given to people along with feeding and care instructions as a way to make money to support their families. When the animals are bred, the first

offspring is given to another needy family and our original gift is passed on to others. Llamas and alpacas are \$150. Sheep, pigs and goats are \$120. Chickens, geese, and ducks are \$20 and honeybees are \$30. Heifer also supports programs for clean water, sustainable farming, and empowering women to become equal participants in farming, business, and leadership roles.

Lessons based on the Heifer Project will be presented in Sunday school classes, and we will be talking about "Llamas for Lent" throughout the Lenten season. Hopefully, this will be a fun project for all of our church members. Plans are in the works for a visit from a llama and other animals at a future date. If you have animals you would like to share or know of someone who would bring animals let me know. (No creepy crawlies, please!)

Upcoming plans are an Easter breakfast, an Easter Egg Hunt, a Winston Salem Dash game, and our annual church picnic in June. Be sure to read newsletters, bulletins and




Kids Club met on January 6.
