Board of Spiritual Growth and Renewal: Jerry Lovell

Board of Business Management and Stewardship

Financial Report: Denise Durham

- Average weekly offering in the month of November was \$3,705
- 2018 benevolences will be paid in December.
- Pledges are running with 44.4% being pledged toward the 2019 budget. Last year 53.6% was pledged toward the 2018 budget.
- We are still exploring e-giving.

Property Committee: John Smith

- There is a problem with the thermostat in the fellowship hall. Sylvester/Cockrum will remove that air handler from the computer and replace with a stand-alone thermostat. The cost is approximately \$1,900.
- Lindsay thanked John who will continue as co-chair of the property committee in 2019.

Board of Community Outreach: Mark Smith reported:

- Mark created an itemized list of annual events this board organizes to be shared with the new chairperson.
- FRUCC rings bells for the Salvation Army Kettle Fund at Lanier Hardware December 14 and 15. All slots were filled.

Evangelism Board: Dave Fulton

- The November Community Meal profit was \$137. That was combined with the September profit. Saving Grace K9's received a check for \$250.
- The Evangelism Board meets monthly.

Old Business:

- Board assignments for 2019 will be emailed to members
- Outgoing Board Chairs meet with incoming chairs to review goals of boards/committees.
- Rev. Horton handed out sheets, Reflecting "Discerning and Dreaming 2019". Boards were asked to fill
 out and return.
- Annual staff evaluations will be conducted in January 2019.
- Everyone was reminded of the gathering at the Horton home December 7th at 6pm.

New Business:

- Discussed reviews of those regularly using church property (Open Hands, Sheets Dance, etc.)
 - * Guidelines for maintenance of building
 - * Who to contact when/if problems with use of buildings arise
 - * Waiver of fees (consistory discretion)
 - * Handing out keys
 - Bonus for custodian for special activities
- Updating and revisions for church manual in January or February.
- A motion was made to change "inactive status of membership" in the church manual from 3 years to 2 years to agree with the church by-laws. Motion was seconded and passed.
- Rev. Horton will be on vacation December 26-January 2
- The next Consistory meeting is scheduled for January 13, 2019.


