Dear First Reformed Family,

I am excited to share we will work with St. Stephen UMC to "adopt" Charles England Elementary School through the end of the 2019-2020 academic year.

HERE'S A LITTLE BACKGROUND:

Last month Cathy Waitman and I attended a breakfast at the Lexington City Schools Administrative Office entitled. "Rallying Our Village to Save our Students." The focus was to connect school principals with local pastors. It was eyeopening to hear school leaders describe so many needs of their students. Due to high poverty in the district, hunger and hygiene concerns are an everyday occurrence. contribute can greatly to academic perforpoor mance.

Also greatly lacking is the presence of enough safe, positive adult influences. Simply put, many students need encouraging, interested adults to be involved and to care.

So many basic needs...for which there are no line items in the budget.

THIS IS WHERE FIRST REFORMED CAN HELP:

The church address is in the attendance zone for Charles England Elementary, which means these students and their families are literally our neighbors. Their principal spoke with us about specific needs, such as underwear and socks. Cathy and I began to conspire with Rev. Arnetta Beverly to adopt this school and seek to show love for our "littlest" neighbors. I was surprised that approximately 90% of the children at the school live at or below the poverty level.

WHAT CAN WE DO RIGHT NOW?

- Immediately, you can pray for this school by name. Lift up to God's ears the students, teachers, and parents. Ask God's guidance in this ministry as we move forward.
- Visit their website. Here is the link: <u>Charles England</u> <u>Elem School</u>
- Drive by the school to see the physical building where future citizens and leaders are learning. (111 Cornelia St, Lexington, NC 27292)
- Begin to think of these students as "our kids."

VOLUNTEER

Wouldn't it be great if we could have a group of First Reformers to volunteer together? It can fit your schedule and no special or high-level academic experience is necessary! Just a willingness to give 20 -30 minutes (biweekly or even monthly) to:

- read to a child, or let a child read to you.
- hold flashcards to help with vocabulary or math skills.
- eat lunch with a student who needs an encourager.

Belinda Yates and I already volunteer once a month with "Rubies and Pearls" for 5th grade girls.

Let me know by MONDAY, APRIL 8 if you have questions or an interest in volunteering on any level. The city school system conducts a background check on all volunteers. Plenty of time still remains before school ends to be a blessing to a child.




ADY Spring? Spring is here! After a long, wet winter it is wonderful to see the bright sunshine,




