Dear Friends,

The beginning of summer brings a different rhythm to life. Beginning June 16th, we will alter the church rhythm as well by beginning worship at 10:30am with no plans for Sunday School beforehand.

While I'm one who really wants to conserve our time for Spiritual Growth (aka Sunday School), I recognize that sometimes we as disciples need a different rhythm as well. So, in lieu of traditional Sunday School I ask all ages to be intentional about your Spiritual Growth over the summer. Use your extra time on Sundays in a sacred way: Invite people to eat that you might not normally; Ask questions and get to know one another on a deeper lev-Find a space of your el. choosing for a spiritual discipline; Paint, write, read, sit, listen. Find a mission where vou can make a difference. Pay attention to children to soak in their laughter and curiosity.

The Conversation on Faith and Race. I am grateful for this space on Tuesdays where differing people have come to learn from one another: To the participants with earnest desires to listen with compassion and to share stories with honesty. As we have discussed tough issues and experiences, I have been quite surprised by the power that humor seems to have in binding us together. In my opinion, the Holy Spirit is laying important groundwork in the work of reconciliation.

The day of the church picnic is the same day as Pentecost, where tongues as of fire seemed to fall from the sky and the Holy Spirit was unleashed on the world! I hope we will be cooled off by the "rush of a roaring wind" under the trees of Wildcat Mountain. When we return to the sanctuary June 16, we'll spend the next few Sundays exploring the theme of God's Intervention. Often, in our contemporary age, we can be uncomfortable with the notion of a God who intervenes from time to time in earthly affairs. But the scriptures are filled with examples of God doing exactly that intervening to correct injustice, bring healing, help the poor, hunary or outcast. Think of the times when God has intervened in your own life.

Open Hands Ministry continues to meet in the Fellowship Hall every Monday night. This not only is a Meal Ministry, but during the summer it's also a "Ministry of the Cool Space". Many people, both homeless and housed, are without Air Conditioning. On 90- degree days, just to enter an air-conditioned building is a gift. Thank you for allowing the church building to be a place of generous hospitality.

Youth Ministry. What are your hopes and dreams for a youth ministry at First Reformed? We find ourselves at a point where we need to be intentional about creating a vibrant ministry for middle and high schoolers. Who will lead us? Do you have a special place in your heart for teenagers? Would you like to help build a ministry here? If you want to discuss building a Youth Ministry, let me know your ideas. Dream big!

May your summer be truly Divine!

### Directions to Wildcat Mountain Farm: 10000 Hwy 47, Denton

- From the church, head North on North Salisbury Street
- Turn right at the stop sign onto East 5<sup>th</sup> Street (becomes Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard then Raleigh Road then Old Hwy 64 East)
- Travel 6.7 miles (staying straight through the 2 stoplights you'll pass) and turn right onto Young Road
- Travel 1.9 miles and turn left onto Jerusalem Road (this will change to Regan Road)
- Travel 2.9 miles and turn right onto Frank Road
- Travel 1.8 miles and turn left at the stop sign onto Hwy 47 East
- Travel 0.6 miles to the entrance to Wildcat on the right
- Travel <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile to the picnic area

We will greet people, share information about First Reformed, give away candy and lapel pins. This is a family-friendly event.


