



ADULT EDUCATION

Saint Francis, in the thirteenth century, is credited with creating the first living nativity, a reenactment of the birth of Jesus in a Bethlehem stable. We will use the life of Saint Francis as a lens to explore the beginnings and variety of nativity and Advent traditions that guide us in looking for signs of God's love in our world, personally and globally.

INTERGENERATIONAL ACTIVITIES FOR THE OTHER SUNDAYS IN DECEMBER Sunday, December 15th:

Our children, youth and adults will explore the Spanish tradition of Las Posadas, a visit to The Inns. This is a nine day tradition which began in villages of Mexico where children, dressed as angels, Mary or Joseph lead a procession to neighbors' homes in a search for safe shelter for the Holy Family to have their child. Each night ends at a home where there are food, songs, and scripture. The adults will be invited to write Christmas notes to loved ones or to members of our congregation who are home bound. The children will celebrate by hitting a Piñata, filled with candies!

Sunday, December 22nd:

Our children, youth and adults will participate in an activity of decorating cookies which will be shared with friends and family.

Sunday, December 29th:

Everyone will gather in the Fellowship Hall at 10:00 for a "Sweet and Salty Gathering." Bring your left over goodies as we greet one another after Christmas.

Sunday, January 5th:

We will celebrate Epiphany as we all gather in the fellowship hall for a craft activity of making decorative Wise Men (Kings). We will celebrate with a King's cake for dessert.

During this Advent Season I invite you and your family to take time in your busy days to read scripture, sing songs and rejoice as you prepare your hearts and minds for the coming of the Holy One among us. A few scripture passages you might share with one another:



Community Garden Wraps Up Another Successful Year ~submitted by Edgar Miller

The last harvests of sweet potatoes and butternut squash are done and most of the garden beds have been planted with clover and rye cover crops for the winter, save for few beds of winter collards, cabbage and greens. This completes the 9th year of the First Reformed Community Garden and our second year in partnership with Open Hands Ministry (OHM) of Davidson County, whose clients tend to the garden working with church volunteer supervision.

This year the garden produced more than 600 pounds of fresh produce for Pastors Pantry and OHM, as well as more than 20 pounds of sweet potatoes donated to Grace Episcopal for their Sunday lunches. The Garden also hosted the first ever "Great Tomato Sandwich Give-away" on July 27, where we gave away tomato sandwiches to more than 50 community residents. On September 15, fourteen church youth harvested 25 pounds of okra, tomatoes, eggplants, peppers and butternut squash.



The Garden ministry and its continuation would not be possible without the financial support of church members and others in



the community, like the Lexington Garden Club, who gave the Garden a \$1,000 grant this year. This funding, and other donations allow us to pay a living wage to the OHM garden workers who maintain the garden beds, keep the garden free of weeds, plant seeds and plants and harvest and deliver the produce.



The Church garden volunteers, garden workers and recipients of the fresh produce very much appreciate those individuals and organizations supporting the Garden ministry. As we prepare to celebrate our 10th anniversary next year, we are grateful for First Reformed UCC's and the larger community's support for this ongoing mission to serve those less fortunate in our community.


