

#### **Board of Community Outreach:**

#### **Board of Congregational Life:**

- Compiling a list of names for nametags, which will be done at cost, thanks to Heidi and Ron.
- Beginning the process of updating the board's responsibilities pages in the manual, which are outdated.

#### <u>Board of Business Management and Stewardship</u> Financial Report:

- Property Committee met to discuss Open Hands using the basement when below 20 degrees. Eddie Yates will find answers to a few questions that were brought up before finalizing plans for assistance.
- In response to a question about Open Hands using our kitchen to prepare Monday night meals, it was decided that our kitchen is not up to code to allow this.
- Items discussed and tabled until more information is gathered...
  - David Driver, Triad Security Systems, will provide quotes on the following to update the church's security...
    - a camera for the blind spot at the sanctuary entrance
    - repair the camera that is burned out in the choir loft.
    - a new monitor for the church office to watch and record the basement door, dance entrance, FH entrance, and the parking lot. (This will replace the current monitor in the church office.)
    - a safer method for the dance en-

trance that includes adding a camera and using the monitor in the dance studio He will also quote the same type of capability as the church office has for speaking and releasing the door from the dance studio.

#### **Old Business:**

- Kitchen Committee and Church Parlor Updates:
   Areas of the kitchen will need to be addressed.
   Eddie volunteered to meet with the Health Department to see what is needed. Mike Price reported the Parlor Committee is still getting prices for updating the Parlor.
- <u>Church Organist/Pianist Search:</u> Harriette Murphy, chair of the Music Committee announced the selection of Robert Wilson as interim organist.
- <u>February's Congregation Meeting</u>: Consistory will showcase ministries to get people involved and look forward rather than backward. Board chairs will speak to things being planned for 2020. Also, signup sheets will be used requesting volunteers who might not have filled out a time and talent sheet. The goal is for everyone to feel welcome and they are a part of church activities.

#### **New Business:**

- Consistory approved the title change for Rev. June Grubb from Minister of Pastor Care to Associate Pastor of Congregational Care.
- Consistory approved the following for Property committee...
  - installing fire alarms and smoke detectors in the basement so Open Hands can stay overnight when temperatures drop 20 degrees or lower.
  - Dusk to dawn lighting over the education building basement entrance, back entrance to the sanctuary and two to illuminate the area between the sanctuary and Nazareth building.

Rev. Amy Petré Hill is the Minister of Mental Health and Inclusion at Mountain View United Church in Aurora, Colorado, and the first UCC minister ordained to mental health and inclusion ministry in a congregation.

She previously worked as a disability rights attorney, spiritual advisor to the Voices for Veterans Mental Health Council of Eastern Colorado, and a chaplain intern at a Colorado state psychiatric hospital. She is a certified Mental Health First Aid Instructor, NAMI Group Facilitator, Soul Shop for Congregations trainer, and currently serves on the United Church of Christ Mental Health Network Board.

"I am delighted to begin this journey with you as interim organist. My prayer is that I can offer the best of my ability to the glory of God and to the edification of his people here at First Reformed. My story as an organist began many years ago. In fact, 31 years ago sitting beside Mrs. Francis – the church organist from my childhood. I was always fascinated with the organ, so Mrs. Francis would put me on the bench beside her at the end of the service, and she would teach me about the organ. Those small "seeds" that she planted when I was five years old have transpired into the organist I am today.

"As I grew, I continued my deep love of playing the organ – including playing for a number of churches. These experiences have shaped me both as an organist and as an individual. I give thanks to God and deep appreciation to those who have helped me along the way, and I try to continue to maintain a spirit of learning and growth no matter what I am doing for God and the people of God.

"In addition to playing the organ, I am also an English Professor at Sandhills Community College. I enjoy teaching, and it has been a rewarding career. I have taught at schools across North and South Carolina, but I relocated to the area to be closer to my brother, who was stationed a Ft. Bragg, in the hopes to getting to see him and his wife more – as they are having their first baby in March. When I am not teaching or in church, I can be found antiquing, gardening, or baking. In the coming weeks, I hope to learn more about each of you, as you will surely learn more about me.

The ADULT MINISTRY TEAM met and reflected on how the current Adult Sunday School book study on "Trouble I've Seen" is going. The feedback was very positive.
