Dear Beloved Community,

As we move back into the newly refurbished sanctuary on Sunday, August 5th, we say a big *Thank You* to the Chair of the Property Committee, John Smith, for his leadership and tremendous effort in coordinating the various projects for the sanctuary update.

Also beginning August 5th is the group study on the book, Bonhoeffer. Dietrich Bonhoeffer is one of the most influential and courageous ministers of the 20th century. While serving in 1930's Germany during the rise of Hitler and the Nazi's, Bonhoeffer separated himself from the Nazified "German Church" and began training seminarians to embody with uncompromising discipleship Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. His faithfulness to God caused him to be imprisoned in a Concentration Camp and ultimately, he was killed.

A word of caution, this book study is not cheerful or lighthearted. Yet it is extremely relevant. It calls us to look deeply into ourselves and our relationship with Christ. It calls us to look at our world and determine how we will live out our faith. The questions he posed to disciples decades ago about Christian Life in Community are ones we need to ask ourselves today. Even if you can't attend the study, please read the book.

As we think about what it means to live as the Body of Christ, I am excited to announce that BRIDGE dinner groups will be starting soon!

Please read inside for details and make plans to be a part of this bridge-building ministry.

We will prepare for these BRIDGE dinner groups by gathering around the Lord's Table for Holy Communion on August 5th and with the sermon series Bread of Life from John's Gospel (*see page 14 for weekly scriptures*), looking at how Christ is made known when we break bread together.

Brothers and sisters, you are the beloved community of God. Thank you for the ways that you live out the call to BE THE CHURCH.

Building an Inclusive Church Update

On Sunday, July 22nd, approximately 70 people, both members and visitors, met in the Fellowship Hall after worship for brunch and discussion about the revised Welcoming Statement. The Welcoming Task Force provided delicious casseroles, fruit, and pastries.

We started out reviewing the process, from the beginning in the Fall 2017 up to this point describing the steps along the way. About 15 response cards were received from the bulletin inserts this summer. The Task Force met July 11 to review the responses and make adjustments to the Welcoming Statement. A copy of the revised statement was on each table for people to read and discuss.

We listened as people shared reactions to the Welcoming Statement. We talked about ideas for where and how the statement would be seen and presented. We looked at a sample of an abridged version to use when the full statement was not feasible.

We discussed the next steps, which are to conduct an anonymous, exploratory survey to the congregation members. The purpose of the "straw poll" is to help us hear from everyone and to assess if we have answered as many questions as possible. Be on the lookout for info about the survey in Mid-August.

I am grateful to those who have been faithful to this process...for showing up, asking questions, making comments and suggestions. The process may seem long and drawn-out to some, yet spiritual discernment is rarely quick.

I continue to believe that open discussions and honest sharing of ideas will strengthen us as a church and ultimately

lead us into the mission to which God is creating for us.

In the meantime, please read through the revised statement written below and give prayer to it. If you were not able to come to the brunch and you have questions please let me know. I pray for God's guidance as we talk and listen to one another.

Revised Welcoming Statement



WEEKEND of SEPTEMBER 15-16

Rev. Al Staggs, a minister and performance artist, will share three presentations. Saturday evening, September 15th, Rev. Staggs will present **"Laughter for Life"**. This program focuses on the spiritual, emotional and physical benefits of humor and features his numerous comedic impersonations.


Sunday morning, September 16th, at 9:45am in the education building, Rev. Staggs will perform **"Clarence Jordan and the God Movement."**

Sunday morning at 11:00am in the sanctuary, Rev. Staggs will perform, **"A View from the Underside: The Legacy of Dietrich Bonhoeffer"**. The audience is brought into the prison cell where Bon-

hoeffer awaits execution and listens to his struggles with evil, injustice, and God. In the play, Bonhoeffer tells of the profound influence of fellow Union Theological student, Frank Fisher, an African-American friend who introduced Dietrich to the blight of racism in America. Prisoner Bonhoeffer expresses moral outrage against the Nazi treatment of Jews and explains how that outrage led him to become involved in the German resistance movement, a commitment that would result in his execution by hanging on April 9, 1945.



As we begin preparation for Rev. Staggs' visit, beginning Sunday, August 5th, during the Sunday school hour, Rev. Horton will lead a class on the Life of Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Our Director of Christian Education, Cathy Waitman, has ordered several books titled, Bonhoeffer Study Guide for those who would like to read and prepare for the Sunday school class. Books will be available in the office.



The East Lexington Collaborative Ministries Group (First Reformed UCC, Second Reformed UCC, Shady Side Presbyterian Church, and St. Stephen UMC) will be having a **Collaborative Bible Study**. The study will be on the book of Psalms and will begin on September 4, 2018 at noon until 1 pm. We will meet in

Please bring your lunch and join us as we study and interact with members of our sister churches.



From Cathy Waitman - Director of Christian Education

We have had a hot, hot summer! Here are some "cooling" ideas for you for the month of August!



To prepare for Al Staggs visit and his portrayal of Dietrich Bonhoeffer in September, we will be studying about Bonhoeffer in Sunday School this month. The lessons are:

August 5 - What is the Church?

August 12 - Living in a Christian Community

August 19 - Religion-less Christianity

August 26 - Come and Die

Bonhoeffer lived in Germany during Hitler's rise to power. He was born into an elite and well-educated family. His mother had a strong Christian faith which greatly influenced him and by the age of 13, he knew he wanted to study theology. When he visited Rome and the Catholic Church at 18 years old, he came to realize that the church was not just the German Lutheran Church he attended, but that it was universal and existed worldwide for diverse groups of people. He traveled all over Europe, in the United States, and Cuba. He commented that the churches in America preached about everything except the gospel of Jesus Christ. The African American churches here were the only churches he attended that preached the gospel. Jesus' Sermon on the Mount was especially important to Bonhoeffer, and he strived to live the life of a servant of Jesus. He was imprisoned for his faith (and his conspiracy with other Germans to assassinate Hitler) and was executed as the Americans were arriving to free Germany.

Al Staggs will be Clarence Jordan during the Sunday school hour on September 16th. We will be learning about Jordan and his Cotton

Patch Gospel the first Sunday of September. Elizabeth will be reading from Jordan's version of the gospel during the worship services in August.


Bless the Back Packs




