Thank you for your flexibility and willingness to change during the effects of the Coronavirus (CoVid-19) pandemic. As we are trying to "flatten the curve" of the spread, we are not holding services in the sanctuary through May 15. While we miss *going* to church, we are now discovering what **Being** the **Church** means without the beauty and sacred space of the sanctuary.

I, too, fall victim to this kind of static mindset. I urge you to think about how God is calling you in the midst of this time. God is most definitely still speaking - even in the most unexpected places.

Consistory members met virtually Wednesday, March 25, 2020 to discuss the continuing effects of the global pandemic outbreak of Covid-19. Gov. Cooper has shut down many businesses and increased the stern request of social distancing, even suggesting self-isolation. Also, all North Carolina schools are now closed through May 15, 2020. A motion was made and unanimously approved for the church to continue practicing social distancing by not gathering as a body for worship services through May 15th. The church will continue to make the services available online. Also, all activities except for Meals on Wheels and Open Hands Monday Night (which will be carry-out only) have been suspended. Consistory will reevaluate the status as needed to comply with the request of Gov. Cooper.

- Continue to provide food for the Charles England Elementary School Backpack Program.
- The Charles England Book Fair will be in April. Several church groups have donated funds to help with purchasing books for those who can't afford them.
- Several FRUCC volunteers read Dr. Seuss books to the students at Charles England Elementary School.

#### **Board of Evangelism: (**Renee Walsh and Dave Fulton)

- Attendance Average for February: 111 (average does not include 95 in attendance for the Ash Wednesday service on February 26)
- The Evangelism Board has secured baritone Leonard Rowe as the guest performer here at First Reformed UCC for a Sunday afternoon concert in May.

# **Board of Worship and Sacrament:** (Raeann Allred and Deanna Michael)

- Thank you to the Music Committee under the leadership of Harriette Murphy for all of their hard work in finding us our new interim organist, Robert Wilson.
- Thank you to all those who served in the capacity of liturgist, usher, greeter, acolyte, Bible steward, Communion preparer and server in the month of February.

#### **Property Committee**: (John Smith and John Maze)

- Buddy Lohr installed a new key lock for the breezeway door
- Met with Danny Young of Young Electric, Johnson Electric and Moore Electric about installing four new dusk-to-dawn lights and a new kitchen outlet. We are still waiting on a couple of estimates.
- Update on Open Hands Ministries use of facility is on hold for the time being due to suggested upgrades, including motion lighting, by the Fire Marshal. Upgrades involve additional expenses.
- David Driver, Triad Security Systems
  - Installed another camera for the sanctuary to cover the blind spot at the corner of the Nazareth building.
  - · Replaced the burned out camera in the choir loft.
  - Installed cameras on the outside of the education building.
  - He still needs the magnet to release the door for the dance studio entrance. Plans are to complete projects in March.

# <u>Financial Report:</u> (Eddie Yates reported for Harriette Murphy)

- Average weekly offering in February was \$4,636
- Music fund Balance \$7.545
- End of Month Available General funds \$4,526

#### Old Business:

- Update of Consistory Manual:
  - Jerry Lovell submitted proposed revisions for the Board of Community Outreach
  - Eddie Yates submitted 2 pages of updated fees for Wedding Policy and Facility Rentals
- <u>Church Parlor Updates</u>: Estimates have been received for painting, flooring and window covering. Plans are on hold due to the need for testing of the ceiling for asbestos.

#### **New Business:**

- Move Property Committee from Board of Business Management & Stewardship: The proposal to change the title for the Property Committee to Board of Property Management was discussed and approved.
- <u>Summer Worship Times</u>: Rev. Horton lead a discussion on advantages and disadvantages of changing summer worship times. Discussion was tabled to the April meeting.
- <u>Board of Faith Formation Chairperson</u>: Alane Holste volunteered to chair the Board of Faith Formation.
- Next Step in Visioning ("Dream Team"): President, Eddie Yates stated the long range planning goal is to have a team of four to five people to look ahead to keep the church going and growing. Guidelines suggested:
  - Discern direction of ministry and infrastructure to make it happen
  - Need action plan
  - Use core group of volunteers regarding renovation to start a Dream Team.
  - Kivi will email those who have volunteered (John Maze, John and Susie Smith, Jerry Lovell, Glenyce Fulton, Belinda Yates and Mike Price)
- Shelter at City Bus Stop: A question was raised concerning the bus stop at the corner of First and Salisbury Streets behind the education building. Should the church provide a trash can? If so, who will empty it? Should there be a shelter? No conclusions were reached.

**Apply to attend Discover in 2020** 

Discover is sponsored by a grant from the Lilly Endowment and so is **FREE for attendees**. However, there is a \$25 registration fee to hold your spot. Please <u>use our alternative registration form</u> if the fee would be a hardship for your family.

There is **no cost** for the student to attend **Discover**. Participants are simply responsible for transportation to and from Black Lake Retreat Center.

**Discover** is a program that challenges formative middle and high school youth with careful theological and moral reflection prior to college life. In the midst of theological reflection and activity, students will have the opportunity to:

- *discover* God in new ways, especially as incarnational and interactive;
- discover who they are as children of God;
- discover how to live out their faith;
- and discover what they are called to do vocationally.

Through a week-long session at Black Lake Retreat Center in Asheboro, participants will:

- explore some of life's most important questions
- grow in faith and sense of calling as we explore each person's sacred worth as a child of God.
- learn and engage theological concepts alongside excellent college and graduate level faculty
- participate in exciting field trips to explore creation, serve others, and grow in knowledge and faith
- **challenge** themselves in activities such as water sports and zip lining
- get to know college-aged Teaching Fellows who will lead them through the week's programming
- grow in community with other participants

During this time of uncertainty, our board has needed to make adjustments.

 Charles England Elementary School contacted us when the schools first closed due to the Coronavirus. Their food pantry had been depleted since extra food was sent home with students in an attempt to cover an extended period. We responded with a \$300 check so staff could shop for nonperishable items that would cover 2-3 weeks.

With the Governor announcing that schools will be closed until May 15<sup>th</sup> at the least, their need will only increase. Your monetary donations are put to good use, as well as the requested food items you donate at church that get delivered to CEES.

- The Clothes Closet is closed due to the need for social distancing.
- Touching Davidson County With Love has been cancelled for April 4, 2020. At this time, the possibility of rescheduling is not known.








# LOOKING AHEAD
