The Consistory met May 17th and approved to continue with the suspension of in-person worship. We'll keep the current schedule having online worship service only through Facebook and YouTube, and then reassess at the June meeting. I am grateful for their wisdom and spirit of leadership.

As we have sought to Be The Church while we are not actually **IN** The Church with passages from Acts, this month we will explore Genesis in the series: "Create and Connect." God's Spirit has been at work since the very beginning, from the creation of the world to the many creative ways God seeks to connect with humanity. In the midst of this pandemic, God seeks to be at work within us and among us, creating and connecting.

Much of the world feels extremely harsh...the rhetoric, language, and the posture of many people in general. I believe this typically stems from an underlying fear or insecurity of some sort. Many are hurting among us and need wounds healed. A powerful way for us to Be the Church right now is to be gentle with one another - with friends and family,

neighbors and strangers, and during this time, be gentle with yourself. Remember you are loved and precious to God. So many need to hear and feel this message too.

Thank you for the ways you have cared for each other, adapted to new ways to connect, and continue in generosity.

So, No. We won't come to church in June. But, Yes...

- We will still worship.
- We will still worship the God who creates.
- We will still worship the God who speaks life into being.
- We will still worship the God who welcomes the stranger and loves the unlovable.
- We will still worship.

WORSHIP VIA YOUTUBE AND FACEBOOK CONTINUES THROUGH JUNE



A LESSON WELL REMEMBERED

Elizabeth Jones was my seventh grade teacher. She was, in my opinion, one of God's great gifts to children. Other than my mother, she had the most profound influence on my life. She not only taught "the three R's", but she also taught life lessons. Those of us who were fortunate enough to be her students were also blessed with this Godly woman who genuinely cared for us.

Fifty-two years young when I was in her class, she was old enough to retire. That, fortunately for me, was not her ambition, to leave that which was her love in life, teaching children! Simply fading off into her sunset years would never do. Elizabeth Jones was not married. Her life was devoted to her students. Oftentimes, she would invite a number of us to her home...and that's where the life-lessons began.

Miss Jones would always have Kool-Aid and homemade cookies for us. I never have had another teacher who cared so much about my future. I am convinced that every child needs an Elizabeth Jones in her/his life.

One of the great lessons Miss Jones taught me was that which "freedom" is all about. Said she that it is a gift to be an American – one that we cannot afford to take for granted. Continuing she said that being free to live as you desire comes with responsibilities to realize that others have the same freedoms and responsibilities.

To fail to live in harmony and mutual regard with all persons in our country would result in chaos. It was difficult for a seventh grader to wrap my mind around such a theory until our beloved mentor brought it home proclaiming, "Your freedom ends where my nose begins." I surmised it to mean that we must respect one another's space. This is the inspiration for today's devotional thought.

During this Covid-19 virus we have learned that in order to be respectful of another person's space we have been called upon to do things that we social animals are not used to doing. We do things like social distancing, sheltering in place, and wearing face masks. As we begin "opening our nation" we are still mindful that we are called upon to remain respectful of all persons. Please remember to stay home whenever possible. Please stay at least six feet from others. Please wear masks when you are near people you could possibly infect. When all is said and done, these sacrifices will be worthwhile.

MAY'S CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

<u>Board of Property Management</u>: John Smith and John Maze

- Danny Young Electric installed four dusk till dawn lights on March 26th to help with security. Young Electric also installed a new wall outlet in the fellowship hall kitchen for the donated dishwasher.
- Buddy Lohr contacted Alley Plumbing the first week of April about hooking up the dishwasher. Buddy hopes to build a cabinet for the dishwasher at the end of May or first of June. When the cabinet is finished Alley Plumbing will be able to complete the project.
- Pine needles were spread April 11th. Thank you to John Maze, Ben Hale, Cliff Lopp and Jeff Hutchens. Thanks also to Rich Johnson for putting the church banner back up on the front lawn of the education building.
- David Driver is to submit a plan to the Fire Marshall for finishing the installation of the alarms, detectors and lighting in the basement in hopes of finishing that project.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Harriette Murphy

- Average weekly offering in April: \$4,977
- End of Month Available General funds \$375
- Music fund Balance \$7,545
- The Financial Secretary applied for and received a Corona Virus PPP (payroll protection program) government loan valued at \$12,990. The church is allowed eight weeks to use these funds and at least 75% must be used for payroll in order for the loan to be forgiven.

New Business:

Administrative Assistant Hours Adjustment:
 Administrative Assistant, Carolyn Robbins requested a temporary decrease of inoffice hours. With church activities on hold and a decrease of visitors her in-house responsibilities have decreased. She will be able to complete portions of her job from home. The consistory wanted office

hours to be consistent. [Editor's Note: temporary office hours are 9am-12pm Monday, Wednesday and Friday.]

- Moving Forward: Ministry Following Covid19: After much discussion, a motion to continue online worship services through the month of June 2020 was approved. Consistory will re-evaluate the status on a month-to-month basis going forward.
- Covid-19 Focus Group: Consistory discussed plans to organize a Focus Group for the purpose of discussing needs for reopening the church buildings. This group would present their suggestions to the consistory for a vote before implementing.
- <u>Church Picnic</u>: Since consistory had already voted to not meet through the month of June, it was decided to postpone the picnic at this time.
- Johns River Valley Camp: The youth summer camp has been closed for the 2020 season.
- <u>PFLAG:</u> The Consistory approved the newly formed chapter of PFLAG Lexington to use the church address and facility for monthly meetings once the church building is open for activities. PFLAG is a group which gives support and resources for LGBTQ people and their families/ friends. John Maze, Belinda Yates and Rev. Horton are on the PFLAG Board.
- Request for Sharing Fundraising Opportunities: Consistory approved to share fundraising opportunities for Jeff Hutchens through church communications and church offerings. Consistory members will continue to fulfill the church's mission during the corona virus by contacting church members by phone calls for with cards.
- The next regularly scheduled Consistory meeting is June 7, 2020.

WHAT?

Ramp-Up-4-Camp is the Spring Fundraiser of Johns River Valley Camp. It allows churches and individuals to support our Summer Camping Program. This year it has more significance than ever. Due to the risks associated with COVID-19, our summer programs have been cancelled. Your gifts are needed more than ever.
