Dear Friends,

Since March, the Consistory, together with the ministerial leadership of the church, has been assessing how the pandemic is impacting our ability to be in the sanctuary together. The deacons and elders have exercised caution and expressed great care for all of the church community. Each month we have prayed and discussed whether or not we felt we could safely return to in-person worship, asking for guidance and wisdom as we seek to be faithful to God and to love our neighbor.

We had hoped that the spread of the virus would have slowed enough over the summer that we could return to worship in the sanctuary this Fall. However, the reports have not reflected this.

As you will see in the Consistory Highlights, the Consistory and ministerial staff are in agreement **to continue to suspend in-person worship in the sanctuary for the rest of 2020.**

We will continue to follow the Phases for NC established by the Governor. Currently we are in "Safer at Home Phase 2." We can gather in the church according to those guidelines — a 10-person limit indoors, and 25-person limit outdoors. We will update whenever NC moves into Phase 3.

Certainly, if the landscape of the spread of

the virus changes drastically for the positive, then we can revisit this decision and make adjustments as needed.

Although we are deeply saddened by this reality, let us please stay encouraged by the ways we are continuing to "Be the Church". We will need to be innovative in how we build the church this Fall and beyond. Such as how we:

- Worship and Praise God together,
- Care for the sick and lonely,
- Grow spiritually in faith formation, continuing to study and learn together,
- Connect and fellowship with one another,
- Care for our community needs,
- Conduct our Annual October budget meeting,

Please continue to keep the faith as we seek to love God and love our neighbor. Remember these words from the Apostle Paul to the Thessalonians: Encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.

MEETINGS IN THE CHURCH BUILDING

Meetings in the church Fellowship Hall may be held, but the following guidelines MUST be followed:

AUGUST'S CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

Pastor's Report

- Throughout summer months Rev. Horton and Rev. Grubb's visits continue to be via phone calls.
- Conversations on Faith & Race Update: The third prayer vigil was August 23rd at Friendship Baptist Church. The goal is to hold a prayer vigil monthly. The vigil on August 23rd honored Rev. Ray Howell for his civil rights leadership.
- Rev. Horton tries to be in the church office on Monday and Wednesday and sporadically throughout the week. Much of ministry now is planning the online worship services.

Board Reports

Board of Congregational Life: Kivi Miller is working on nametags for all members when we are able to meet in person for church services. She is adding new member names and making corrections. She plans to place the order within the next month.

Board of Faith Formation: Alane Holste confirmed the following information as submitted by Rev. Susan Morris, Associate Pastor of Faith Formation:

- Communities in Schools campaign to collect funds for the purchase of school supplies continues through the month of August.
- Activities over the past month include:
 - * Youth and Children zoom meetings on pause
 - * Both youth and children teams worked on the "Drive-thru Backpack Blessing"
 - * Adults' Sunday school completed a study on "Invitation to Genesis" and Tuesday night book study on "White Fragility" continues into September.
- Upcoming Events:
 - * Rally Day postponed
 - * Both youth and children teams working toward a movie night and the youth team is hopeful for a bonfire this fall.
 - * October 18, 2020 is Children's Sabbath
 - * Children's Ministry Team members will write letters to children and Youth Ministry Team members will write letters to youth for the school year.
 - * High-School Youth meetings resume on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays in September and Middle School Youth will resume meetings on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays.
 - * Fifth Wednesday game meeting with children and youth groups
 - * Adult Sunday school studying the book of Exodus in the fall, starting in September.

Board of Worship and Sacrament: Rev. Horton said communion will be scheduled for the first Sunday every month.

Board of Property Management: John Smith reported.

- John Smith, Eddie Yates and John Maze met with Kelly Greathouse who requested to end the rent contract between First Reformed UCC and Sheets Dance Academy. She agreed to schedule a deep cleaning of the area once the move is complete. Property Chairs agreed to clean and restore the floors.
- An estimate of \$350 has been received from Grady Hedrick to remove the tree in front of the breezeway of the education building. Plans are to remove it within the next two weeks.
- Nathan of Central Services repaired the AC in the sanctuary and the 3-way light switch at the back entrance to the education building Fellowship Hall.
- Cliff Lopp replaced the battery of the kitchen smoke alarm.

Financial Report: Harriette Murphy reported

- Average weekly offering in July was \$6,247 (2nd quarter end created a better average)
- Available General funds \$17,023 and Music fund Balance \$7,595
- The Finance Committee will meet August 26th to begin preparation of the 2021 budget.

Old Business:

- Consistory Members continue to make calls to the congregation during the covid-19 pandemic.
- Purchasing livestream equipment for the sanctuary is still a work-in-progress.

New Business:

- Return to Sanctuary: Based on recent outcomes of school/college re-openings, it was decided not to return to sanctuary services through December 2020. Evaluations will be done on a quarterly basis instead of monthly. There was discussion to consider options for the October congregational meeting.
- Church gatherings of 10 or fewer people will be allowed in the Fellowship Hall but certain rules must be followed. (see announcements on page 4)
- Future Event Planning: We will look at adapting to new ways of connecting to church members, such as congregational meetings. We need to think of ways for authentic ministry in the digital age. Probably continue to use the combination of small groups, zoom connections, emails, regular mail and phone calls for now.
- The next regularly scheduled Consistory meeting is **September 13, 2020.**

A NATION ON ITS KNEES

Every Sunday at the conclusion of our worship hour we hear Pastor Elizabeth in her "sending out" quote from the Prophet Micah saying, "He has shown you, O people, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God."

As the service ends I cannot help but to think during the Covid-19 crisis just how have we been doing as a nation in relation to the matters of justice, kindness, and humility. Well. . .I guess that depends upon just to whom you are listening. The conservative media will tell you to "stay the course, all is well." The liberal media will paint a picture of "doom and gloom." And the President is just "somewhere out there"..."deriding and dividing." The Center for Disease Control seems to give us conflicting information depending upon the different messages from each scientist that the Administration places before us. What is a bewildered nation to do?

In relation to justice, kindness, and humility. . .those things of which we as the people of God, have some control over in our individual lives, I suggest for the sake of our own sanity that we should pray without ceasing, think for ourselves, and do the good wherever and whenever for whomever possible.

I believe "doing kindness" is the easiest of the three commissions. It certainly is the simplest. As the people of God, we all have the love in our hearts and our minds to see and to know the need of those in our nation who could use our sacrificial gifts to make their lives better. Covid-19 only makes these acts of kindness more needful and effectual.

Doing justice is not quite so easy. We really have to think about this one. Covid-19 has brought to the fore many needs of the less fortunate. Certainly the struggles of the impoverished and disenfranchised of our nation have been brought to our attention. Covid-19 is indiscriminate in its assault on all people. However, we have seen that the most vulnerable are those who are non-white, aged, have life-threatening con-

ditions, and are forced to live in unhealthy, impoverished conditions, I believe justice for our Lord Jesus was very explicit. "Do unto others as you would have others do unto you." The question that faces those of us who are so well blessed is just how do we define and display justice? In relation to this pandemic, how can we best use our resources to make sure as many of our sisters and brothers receive the justice all people deserve.

Without a doubt, this Covid-19 pandemic has caused us individually and corporately to take a good, long look at ourselves as to our assets, and vulnerability of all that we possess. When we walk humbly with God, we recognize the susceptibility for which we are exposed with all our blessings. We must ask ourselves, "if for some reason our many blessings were somehow diminished and we found ourselves impoverished and disenfranchised, just what would we do?" Friends, Covid-19 has done that to many of our sisters and brothers. As I said, it is an indiscriminate disease. Our country is reeling from that which has already taken nearly 150,000 lives of family members, friends, fellow country persons.

In our arrogance, our audacity, our pretention, we have been brought to our knees by something that we do not yet comprehend, and in our impatience and anxiety to wait upon a scientific answer. Nor will we use our spirituality to wait upon God who will renew our strength. Covid-19 could care less either way. It will take advantage of us at every opportunity.

People of God, everything that happens is not God's Will! Certainly this pandemic is not. But God can work the Divine Will in all things that happen. How will we respond?

Covid-19 has brought us to our knees. While we are down there..."Let us pray!"

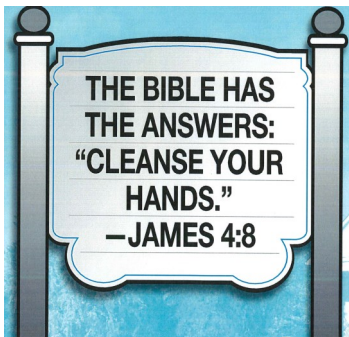

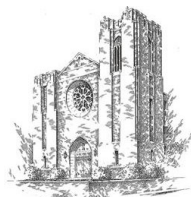
