What is essential? This is one question we have engaged many times since March 2020. During the pandemic and unrest of 2020, we have had to get back to the basics in so many aspects of our lives, seeking clarity in the midst of chaos, straining to figure out what is essential and what is not: wrestling with the question, "If we can't have everything the way we it, want what then is essential?" Which workers? Which Which medical grocery items? procedures? Which parts of school are essential? And even in church life, we have tried to discern what is ministry essential for and worship. Some answers come easier than others.

I hope you will find a way to connect with the church this Advent season.

From an irrigation system leak that flooded our newly planted potatoes in the Spring to canceling in-garden events like the Great Tomato Sandwich Give-Away and the loss of volunteers, we faced some pretty significant hurdles.

Despite those challenges and due to the ongoing commitment of our church and community to support the garden ministry, the garden still produced 350 pounds of fresh produce for food-insecure families in our community. The pandemic and racial tensions also posed even greater challenges for garden workers from Open Hands Ministry of Davidson County, but their dedication never waivered and they were always there when we needed them.

As we wrap up our 10th year of the Community Garden, it serves as a reminder that we can achieve so much more working together than focusing on our differences. "Many hands make light work," as the old saying goes. Although, the garden produced less this year, the produce was never more appreciated than it was this year at Pastor's Pantry.

As we look forward to planning the 2021 growing season, we want to thank all the church and community members who have supported the garden financially and hope we can count on you again next year to sustain this important ministry.






