At the beginning of March, Robert Wilson began as our interim organist. Quite frankly, we didn't know how worship would be without Lee Ann Peele at the keys. And then God sent Robert. After only one service in the sanctuary, Covid hit and our services went online. Again, we were left unsure about the future. And yet, Robert has done a tremendous job providing music in worship and also adapting to the ever-changing circumstances; not only by playing the organ, but recording himself doing so, and teaching us about hymns and the church's organ along the way. Robert has been exactly who this church needed during this season of virtual services. And we have been reassured of a simple, yet, sometimes hard to believe tenet of our faith: **God will always provide.** We will need to keep this in mind over the next couple of months, as our season with Robert will end on December 31 of this year. Below are his own words describing his decision not to renew his contract.

"First, for a long time, I have felt the call of God on my heart for pastoral ministry. I am most at peace when I am offering my service to God in pastoral ministry. With that, I feel that I must answer this call, so that I am pursuing what I feel God has laid on my heart. I shared this calling with Elizabeth when I first came, and a few nights ago, I shared this sentiment again.

Second, I want to be very clear that I have enjoyed my time here. This has been a most gracious congregation to serve and work

among. The people are warm, welcoming, and gracious. The organ is fantastic. This church has been as much a blessing to me, as I hope I have been to it. The people here are amazing, and I can certainly see the spirit of God at work in this place.

Third, both Ellen and Elizabeth have been wonderful to work with. Elizabeth has tried to create authentic worship experiences, and Ellen and I have worked closely together to make these visions a reality. In addition, Ellen and I have worked well to maintain music for the digital services and other events that the church has had need of. It has been an honor to serve alongside both of them.

Finally, I thank each and every one of you for the amazing opportunity that I have had to grow and blossom here. God is at work in this place, and just as he sent me to you, he will provide a path forward from here. Transitions are never easy, but when God is present, ministry will take place. God has a purpose in all things, and there is a purpose even in this transitory season. Again, I cannot thank you enough for the amazing opportunity to have been your interim organist."

We give thanks for Robert's ministry among us.

We give thanks that he is following the call of God in his life for pastoral ministry.

We give thanks, in these circumstances, that God will continue to provide for us all.

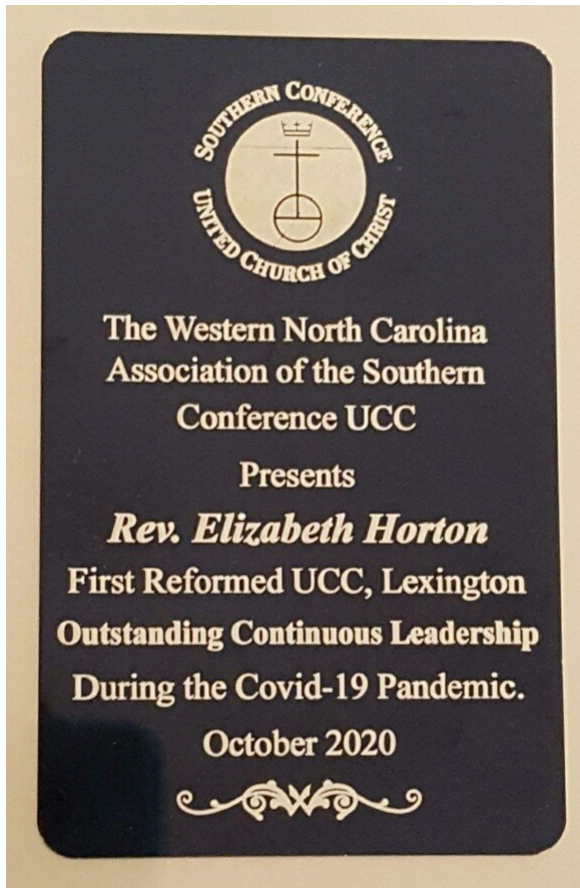

REFLECTIONS FOR HOMECOMING 2020

Hello, I am Peggy Bailey Bates. Rita Lohr, from the Homecoming Committee, asked me to share a few memories about our church.

I was born on June 22, 1932. My parents were members of our church, and I was baptized on October 30, 1932 by Dr. J.C. Leonard. I grew up in our church, being in Sunday school and church. As a teen some of our youth went to the Methodist Church for their youth meeting. I joined that church and married Ed Bates at the Methodist Church.

Ed did not want to come to the Methodist Church. He had gotten out of the Navy and had not attended church. He said he would go to the First Reformed Church because all his family and my family were members there. We talked to Rev. Peeler and he accepted us one day in the sanctuary. I told people Ed and I came in the door running, as we got involved in Sunday School, choir, circle, men's meet-

ings and ball games. I taught Sunday school in Kindergarten with my late dear friend Pat Potts.

Marguerite Leonard was secretary for the Church and a wonderful organist. She wanted to quit being the secretary. Rev. Schaffer was the minister, and he asked me if I wanted the job. I accepted and was there when we moved in our Educational Facility. I quit and Paula Lopp took my place.

Marguerite was also the president of the Morning Glory Circle, which she also passed on to me. Barbara Schaffer, wife of Rev. Schaffer, suggested that the Morning Glory circle have a dinner and bazaar to raise money for the new Education Building we were building. I was the President. This was a big event. We had people all lined up East Center Street, and we ran out of food.

I miss our church. My life has changed. Thanks for the DVD services. May God bless each of you.

A taste of history

Add a yummy, authentic touch to your Thanksgiving meal with this recipe.



What you need:

- 2/3 cup heavy cream
- pint jar with lid
- strainer
- bowl
- container
- salt



What you do:

1. Pour cream into the jar and close the lid tightly.
2. Shake vigorously about 8 minutes, until a solid lump of butter forms. (Take turns with a friend!)
3. Strain the contents, catching the buttermilk in a bowl to save for another recipe.
4. Put the butter in a container. Add salt to taste.
5. After chilling the butter, enjoy on fresh bread.

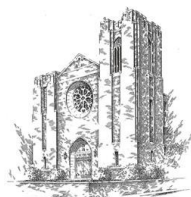
