These are some of the questions the Consistory and I tackled together on January 24th during our virtual retreat: **Connect and Engage**.

Most leadership retreats consist of casting a vision and planning accordingly. Well, you can imagine that was pretty difficult for us to do, since we were not exactly sure what to plan for or when to plan it!

This led us to a different kind of conversation we needed in order to move forward: Church life and ministry will never be the same as it was pre-pandemic.

Some trends we are most likely to see in 2021 and beyond are*:

- 1. Most Attendees May No Longer Be **IN** the Room.
- 2. Community and Connection Will Be More Important than Attendance.
- 3. Generational Differences Will Become Clearer than Ever.
- 4. Spiritual Entrepreneurs Will Thrive
- 5. Growing Churches Will:
 - A. Shift from Gathering to Connecting

- B. See the Internet and their Building Differently
- C. Fulfill their Mission Rather than Seek to Fill their Sanctuaries.

"The biggest mistake churches will make is the emotional rush to get back into the sanctuary, to see everyone again, to assemble their teams and get back to 'normal.' They'll re-embrace a model of ministry designed to reach a world that no longer exists."

As difficult as it is, we must face this reality and allow God to lead...helping us adapt and grow into this new frontier of ministry.

I am confident that the 2021 Consistory, made up of Deacons and Elders from different generations and life perspectives, is fully equipped to grapple faithfully with our present and our future.

Although the worship and ministry life of First Reformed looks totally different than it did one year ago, there are still signs that God is at work.

Remember, the Church began by the sea of Galilee, when two fishermen stopped what they were doing, set down their nets and answered when Jesus said, "Follow me."



Board Reports

Board of Property Management:

John Smith reported Nathan at Central Services repaired the boiler in the Education Building. Also, stopped by January 4, 2021 to fix the kitchen lights that stopped working.

Board of Business Management & Stewardship:

Harriette Murphy reported the Average Weekly offering for December was \$5956. (The amount needed weekly is \$5904.) General Fund was \$19, 258 and Music Fund, \$9248.

Rev. Horton explained the Pastor's Discretionary Fund as money set aside for community needs or our congregation, should someone need assistance.

Pastor's Report for December 2020:

Rev. Horton read the installation questions to members and shared the plan for ordination when in-person services are possible. She asked for all members to embrace this year of change and allow reformation. Our guiding light should be connecting and engaging people. We need to determine how we are relevant as a church. For 2021: What does our ministry need now? We should engage as much as we can. Rev. Horton shared her schedule for the office and other ministerial activities. We have had 327 Facebook likes and have

381 followers. For YouTube there are 70 subscribers. This may reflect how we can connect digitally.

Old Business

Raeann thanked members for agreeing to serve as chairpersons of boards and asked them to work on committees so they could be shared in the February Newsletter.

New Business

- Organist Search Committee is being organized so a search for a new organist can begin.
- The Faith Formation position has not yet been posted. A search committee is required, but first the church needs to decide exactly what we need Faith Formation to accomplish.
- January 2021 Retreat was scheduled for January 24th from 1:00-2:30. The meeting will be virtual.
- John Smith met with Mike Price and Vicky Gray about planting shrubs and a tree in front of the Education Building at the breezeway. Six people from the Property Committee voted to approve their plan. Mike Price will also move the plastic urn from the Columbarium. Vicky will continue to plant flowers around the church sign and Mike will plant flowers in the urns at the Sanctuary entrance.
- Rev. Horton asked if worship services should be in person or remain virtual. Raeann shared that Consistory had previously voted to continue virtual services through January 17th. All members agreed virtual services should continue through the end of February.
- Regarding meetings at the church, it was decided that with the high number of cases of Covid in NC, meetings in the church should continue with no more than 10 people in attendance.
- Next Consistory Meeting: February 7th.

Our church is happy to announce a free Saturday lunch will be available to the public starting February 13th! Open Hands and First Reformed have joined to start this new lunch program because of a need in the community. All days of the week are covered for a meal with the exception of Saturday. We will serve a pick-up lunch at 12:30 on Saturdays out of the Fellowship Hall kitchen at First Reformed UCC.

There will be five or six cooks, each with a team of 4 to help plate, package, and hand off to our friends waiting outside. The program will follow strict social distancing requirements, as well as hand washing, masks, and glove usage. The food will be brought into the kitchen at the Fellowship Hall. The cook and one other team member will plate the food. A person at the entrance will be given the plate of food to package with utensils and dessert. Then that person

will hand off to another team member at the exit of the building to hand out to the person waiting for the meal outside. We are copying many of the same guidelines used at Grace Episcopal Food Ministries, which has been very successful.

If you want to help serve, please contact John Maze at 704-524-6462. John needs a team and would enjoy having some First Reformed team members! With six cooks, the Saturday meal won't put all of the pressure on one team. We will alternate to ensure we get our Saturday home time as well. The plan now is to serve on John's team every 5th or 6th Saturday, depending on the number of cooks that have committed to this new food ministry.
