To comply with Governor Roy Cooper's requests to help prevent the spread of Covid-19, Consistory members met virtually via Zoom

Board Reports

Community Outreach: Robert Danze

After several workdays, the Clothes Closet has been reorganized and spread out into several rooms in the basement space to prepare for the next time it will be open to the public.

Worship and Sacrament: Lisa Nelson & Kivi Miller

Lisa reported committee members are in place for this board. The Music Committee met on February 10 to discuss the search for a new organist.

Kivi Miller reported the Digital Worship Committee met to collect information on worship services during the pandemic and equipment, both existing and new, that may be needed to switch to live streaming of worship services.

Property Management: John Smith

The plastic planter has been moved to the area outside the Center Street door of the breezeway for future flower planting. Contacts have been made for estimates on a water leak in the Education Building. A vent has been replaced in the sanctuary boiler.

<u>Board of Business Management & Stewardship</u>: Harriette Murphy

The Average Weekly offering for January was: \$3449. (The amount needed weekly is \$5904.) We have \$17,390 in the General Fund and \$9323 in the Music Fund.

Old Business

- The Saturday Lunch Program will move to St. Stephens any time there is a conflict with a church function.
 - John Smith reported the cabinets in

the downstairs kitchen (at the old Men's Bible Class) are coming away from the wall. Plans are in progress to repair this.

 Smithie Parrish announced a planned Zoom meeting for parents on February 11th to discuss children and youth ministries

New Business

- Pastoral Relations Board: It is time to form/appoint members for this board. It should be a group of 5 that rotates every 2 years. The Pastor and Consistory will recommend names and the Consistory will choose 5 of those to serve.
- Travis White & Renee Walsh Wedding (April 24, 2021): This wedding approved to proceed with all Covid protocols in place.
- Basement Clean Up: The basement in the Education building needs to be cleaned out. The History Committee will go through to see if there is anything that needs to go into the History Room. Once this is completed, a group will beain to clean out the rest.
- Virtual Services: The consistory approved to continue virtual services through the end of March.
- <u>Next Consistory Meeting:</u> The next meeting is scheduled for March 7, 2021.

IMMEDIATE PRAYER PARTNERS

One responsibility of the Board of Evangelism is to involve church members in the well-being of one another. One way this is done is through intercessory prayer. Praying for another person is a powerful ministry that connects us more deeply to others and amplifies the needs before God.

Sometimes prayers are needed/wanted due to emergencies or other unexpected circumstances beyond the concerns in our weekly bulletins. Formerly called the Prayer Chain, our newly named prayer ministry is **Immediate Prayer Partners**, coordinated by Patti Lovell.

The Immediate Prayer Partner Ministry begins by calling Rev. Horton, the church office, or Patti Lovell with your prayer request. It will then be shared with volunteers who have made a commitment to offer intercessory prayer immediately when they receive the message. SATURDAY LUNCH PROGRAM

Thank you to all of those who are volunteering for Saturday Lunch. Bad weather stopped us from launching on February 13th, but we were able to kick off the program February 20th. Nineteen people were served. Jerry Lovell was also able to get clothes for people in need by printing request forms to be completed based on needs. Orders will be filled and ready for pick up on February 27th. It is exciting to see that number of people in the beginning of a new program!

A team from Macedonia UMC is serving the meal the first Saturday of the month, an Open Hands team the third Saturday of the month, and three teams from First Reformed serve the second and fourth Saturdays. We have plenty

of volunteers for Team 2 to rotate months instead of serving every month. We need two more people for Team 4 to be able to rotate months, as well. We are providing meals in the safest possible manner for all involved.

PASTORAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The Consistory needs your help to form a **Pastoral Relations Committee** in accordance with our bylaws. The committee is made up of 5 people who normally will serve two-years on a rotating basis. However, since this committee hasn't been active recently, two people will serve two years and three people will serve three years so everyone doesn't rotate off at the same time. Committee members are appointed by the Consistory from a list of 12 names provided by the pastor and the congregation. Below is a description of the committee's responsibilities as written in the by-laws.

ARTICLE VIII CHURCH BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 2. Committees:

Pastoral Relations Committee: The Pastoral Relations Committee will monitor the relationship between the pastor and the people of First Reformed UCC. A pool of names (up to 12 people) will be presented by the pastor and members of the congregation to the Consistory. The Consistory, in consultation with the pastor, will appoint the members to serve on the Committee. The Committee will consist of five (5) people who will serve two-year terms on a rotating basis.

The Pastoral Relations Committee will:

- Provide support for the pastor through mutual trust and confidentiality;
- Clarify the pastor's position description and mutual expectations about what the pastor is to do and what has priority. This most likely will involve periodically clarifying and renegotiating expectations.
- Provide an opportunity for the pastor to reflect in confidence about personal concerns, hopes, ambitions and frustrations;
- Openly and honestly communicate feelings and reactions of church members to the pastor;
- Monitor the ministry evaluation process (once every four years, or as needed) based upon strategic planning process by pastor and congregation. This evaluation looks at the mutual ministry of pastor and congregation;
- Demonstrate concern and support for the pastor's family;
- Encourage "self-care" of the pastor by encouraging and supporting time for recreation, exercise, relaxation, family and solitude (daily, weekly, yearly);
- Advocate and support plans for the pastor's sabbatical leave, the length of the leave being directly proportional to the time served as the congregation's pastor, beginning at the
 four year mark;
- Plan celebrations of personal and professional milestones, including a yearly "Pastor Appreciation Day".

The Pastoral Relations Committee is not:

- A salary review committee;
- A channel for complaints;
- An evaluation committee;
- Have decision-making power, just advisory. Can only make recommendations to the Consistory.
