# APRIL 4<sup>th</sup>, EASTER SUNDAY, will be our first inperson Sunday worship! Here's a bit of what to expect:

- Temperatures and attendance will be taken at the door.
- Masks will be worn, we have plenty of extras if you need one.
- Some pews will be taped off and seating will be limited to a few in each pew to maintain social distance. This means some of you will have to sit closer to the front.
- No congregational singing, but still plenty of beautiful music!
- Even though we won't share hugs or handshakes right now, we can still greet and share peace with one another in others ways.
- Bulletins set up ahead of time so that you will know that no one has touched these items for days.
- Offerings may be received on your way in or out of the church.
- Bathrooms are available; we have disinfectant spray for you to use afterwards.
- These precautions may seem excessive. They are important so we don't increase the chances that someone may be exposed to COVID-19. Doing these things show that we care about the health of everyone. How would we feel if someone caught the virus at church and became sick?
- If you don't feel well, please stay home.

# **NEW ADULT BIBLE STUDY**

**Living the Resurrection: Easter Season**, a new Sunday Morning Bible Study via ZOOM, will begin April 11th at 9:15AM

Easter is not a day, it is a season. So our new Bible study sessions will be a six-week series which brings us up to Pentecost. The joy of Easter needs to sustain us until the Spirit can launch us into the next phase of experiencing the "kin-dom" of God.

The twentieth-century humorist, Evan Esar said, "Easter is the only time when it is perfectly safe to put all your eggs in one basket." Who knows what that means? It is about leaning into Easter with all your faith, with all your hope. Living the Resurrection is about putting all your spiritual eggs in the basket of new life...new hope. It is our hope that through this long, important series, we can try on our new Easter clothes, living into what this gift is all about.

We call ourselves Easter people, but what does that mean? How do we live in the real world as those who are fully committed to the promise of Easter? What does it look like for a community of faith to grab hold of this new way of living, this new way of being a part of the "kin-dom" of the Resurrected One?

We will focus on the lectionary text found in John's gospel. which are stories that follow the resurrection of Jesus. Our question throughout this series is, "How does this help me live today?"

Grasping an historical understanding of the text is always a valuable exercise, and we will do some of that as we go through the series. But in the end, it is about application. It is about more than just understanding what happened; it is really about living the Resurrection, right here and now.

There will be no Bible Study on Easter Sunday, but the series will pick up on April 11th with the following gospel text and session titles:

April 11: John 20:19-31 "Unless I See"

April 18: Luke 24:36b-48 "Touch and See"

April 25: John 10:11-18 "Listen to My Voice"

May 2: John 15:1-8 "Abide In Me"

May 9: John 15:9-17
"No Greater Love"

(Mother's Day)

May 15: John 17:6-19 "We Are Yours"

May 22: Pentecost Sunday

# **CLOTHES CLOSET**

# Jerry Lovell, Clothes Closet Chairperson

The **Outreach Ministries** here at First Reformed continue to grow to better meet the needs of our community. Plans have been put in place to provide both meals and clothing to as many people as possible, ultimately combining the two ministries. St. Stephen's, Macedonia, Grace, and First Reformed churches, along with Open Hands and Meals on Wheels are all actively engaged in supporting these outreach projects.

Due to continued Covid guidance, people are not yet allowed to shop for themselves from The Clothes Closet, which is located on the lower level of our Education Building. Part of the collaboration of these groups is to distribute order forms for items from The Clothes Closet.

Volunteers from First Reformed are vital parts of each of these programs. Every Sunday, Grace Episcopal has volunteers, on a rotating basis, to cook and hand out lunches and order forms for clothing. Every Monday, Wednesday and Friday breakfast is available at St. Stephen's, along with Clothes Closet order forms. On Saturdays, First Reformed is the site for lunches that can be picked up and order forms are available there, too. (This ministry is only a few weeks old and is growing; going from 20 to 55 meals served in less than four weeks!) For these groups, Clothing Closet orders can be picked up through the week using Open Hands or at the next regularly scheduled meal date.

Meals on Wheels has greatly expanded our clothing ministry. Volunteers have order forms available to give clients on the routes and return them to the Church Office when the requests are completed. The orders are filled and can be delivered on the next visit by Meals on Wheels.

In the scriptures, we are told that those who feed the hungry, clothe the poor, and offer shelter are serving angels without even knowing it. Angels are being served!







Here is an example of one order form that was received by The Clothes Closet. This request has a powerful message, highlighting an example of the extreme need in our community; the order could be filled (along with additional items) because of your donations.

First Reformed is in the process of making space available for those in need during the frigid temperatures that we can have here. This should be available for use next winter.

# **YOUTH NEWS**



# Returning to in-person worship:

The Board of Worship and Sacrament met. Lisa Nelson reported that Easter service can take place in the sanctuary, with Fellowship Hall if needed. All precautions will be used including temperature checks, contact tracing, no congregational singing. A survey about attendance

will be sent to members and regular visitors. Rev. Horton feels it's time to shift from recorded services to in-person worship. Preparations are being made for a "Walk-Thru Stations of Holy Week" in the Sanctuary, which will include Holy Communion. An abbreviated Easter service will be live-streamed as well as in person. We will follow State guidelines for attendance capacity.

#### Basement clean up:

Rita Lohr and Cliff Lopp surveyed the 2 storage areas in the basement for items of interest for the History Room. All items of historical value were removed.

### • Organist search:

After interviewing, the Music Committee recommended a candidate for the organist position. The Executive Committee met and offered a contract.

Raeann Allred has received some names for this board. The purpose of this board is to support the minister.

#### • Saturday Lunch Program

After the first weeks, the program is going well. Anyone interested in volunteering should contact John Maze.

#### **Clothes Closet:**

Clothes Closet is going well. Jerry Lovell is very active with this. Saturday Lunch Program and Meals on Wheels coordination has been very effective. Request forms are in the office for special orders from the closet.

#### **New Business:**

- Susie Smith will co-chair Board of Congregational Life with Mike Price.
- Immediate Prayer Partners is now in place with Patti Lovell chairing this committee. Information has been shared in the newsletter, bulletins and weekly email.
- Renee Walsh reviewed responsibilities of the Board of Evangelism. The outside church signs will be updated with the time of worship service. Rev. Horton said that the time of worship service will change to 10:30AM so we will not have to change signs again for the summer schedule.

# FIRST REFORMED COMMUNITY GARDEN IN TRANSITION

After a successful decade of producing fresh harvests for Pastors' Pantry and Open Hands Ministry of Davidson County, the First Reformed Community Garden is looking to become more sustainable in the future. This year we have been unable to find workers from Open Hands for some of the more physical labor in the garden, for which they were paid a living wage. If you know of someone who might be interested in serving as a volunteer or paid onsite garden coordinator, please let Edgar Miller know (edgarmmiller@gmail.com). The position involves working about 10-12 hours per week on a variety of tasks in the garden.

While we would prefer to have an on-site coordinator long-term, in the interim we are encouraging different organizations to "adopt-a-garden bed." For example, our church's Girl Scout Troop 2160 has adopted the potato beds. They planted potatoes and onions on March 13 and will periodically check on the beds, weed them when necessary and harvest the potatoes when they are ready.

We also are working with the local "Kidz Dreamz Club" to give the extended daycare kids an experiential learning experience about growing their own food. They have been assisting with vegetable bed weeding and preparation. The Kidz will be adopting the metal garden beds to grow cucumbers, carrots, spinach and basil this Spring.

Other garden beds in need of adoption include the perennial blueberry and asparagus beds and the pollinator garden, as well as the annual summer garden bed, which is currently planted in cover crops but in the future will have peppers and eggplants. Please let Edgar know if you're interested in adopting one of these beds, and he'll get you started and tell you all you need to know. The asparagus should be popping up through the soil any day now and the blueberries are off to a great start, so whoever adopts those are going be in for some savory and sweet treats.

In addition, we're continuing to partner with the Davidson County Local Food Network and Cooperative Extension to hold "grow your own" gardening workshops and to use the garden as an educational resource to help food-insecure individuals and families learn how to grow their own produce. This has long term implications for the overall quality of life and good health outcomes for our community.

As always, we are appreciative of the church members' support and welcome your ideas on how we can better engage the congregation in our garden ministry. Also, please consider a donation to the Community Garden Fund, which is critical for the garden's long-term sustainability.








# **NEW ADULT EDUCATION BOOK STUDY**

A new book study will begin on Tuesday, April 13th at 7:00PM via ZOOM. Edgar Miller will facilitate this study of the book Natural Saints: How People of Faith Are Working To Save God's Earth. Author Mallory McDuff has collated stories of faith groups and organizations who have tackled various aspects of environmental issues.



The important topics included for discussion throughout this book coordinate well with Earth Day celebrations in the month of April. The Adult Education Team encourages members of the congregation to join us in the study.

Several copies of the book will be available in the church office after Easter or you may order your own copy from your favorite bookstore. About the Book: Natural Saints shares the stories and strategies of contemporary church leaders, parishioners, and religious environmentalists working to define a new environmental movement, where justice as a priority for the church means a clean and safe environment for all. Author Mallory McDuff shows that a focus on God's earth is transforming both people and congregations, creating more relevant and powerful ministries. As a result, people of faith are forming a new environmental movement with a moral mandate to care for God's earth.

# **McDuff Highlights Eight Key Ministries:**

protecting human dignity
feeding the hungry
creating sacred spaces
responding to natural disasters
promoting justice
making a pilgrimage
educating youth
bearing witness

With two daughters in tow, she traveled across the country to document environmental actions grounded in faith. This journey transformed the author's own faith and hope for a sustainable future. Congregations and individuals seeking to integrate care of creation into their faith community will find inspiration and concrete advice in the lives of these natural saints.




