WE WELCOME BRUCE W. TIPPETTE AS PIANIST TODAY. He is a composer, performer, and educator. He holds a Master of Music from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts in music composition and a Bachelor of Music in both music composition/theory and music education from Appalachian State University. His published compositions for chorus, concert band, orchestra, handbells, and solo/small ensembles have been performed internationally. Tippette has composed for choreographers, film, and has co-composed music for a children's musical. His work <u>Unconquered</u>, written for orchestra, won the 2012 Mary Starling Composition Competition, and the Winston-Salem Symphony performed it four subsequent times. Additionally, he was chosen in 2012, 2013 and 2014 to compose five new works as part of an experimental collaboration with Cirque du Soleil and the University of North Carolina School of the Arts.

Tippette is a North Carolina Teaching Fellow and received the Lynn Freeman Olson Composition Award for his piano solo <u>Dance of Fire</u>. As an educator, he teaches music composition, theory, piano, and voice at the Community Music School of the University of North Carolina School of the Arts, and he is the Youth Music and Handbell Director at Augsburg Lutheran Church. He works as a collaborative pianist in the School of Drama at UNCSA, a freelance engraver for The Leupold Foundation, a publisher of organ music, and is a frequently sought-after rehearsal accompanist. He resides in Winston-Salem, North Carolina with his wife and frequent collaborator, Elizabeth, and their son and daughter.

NEW IN-PERSON BIBLE STUDY BEGINS SUNDAY

On Sunday, July 18th an adult Bible study will be offered "in person" in the church Parlor at 9:30 a.m. We are continuing with the Lectionary series provided through the United Methodist Church. The seven-week series, entitled "Geared Up for Life," takes a walk through the Epistle to the Ephesians. This epistle divides neatly into two halves - the first half, Chapters 1-3, provides a theological foundation for the faith in some of the most beautiful language in the Epistles. The second half, Chapters 4-6, focuses on the ethical dimensions of the faith: How do we live it out? This second half reminds us that faith isn't simply about believing, but about living. 
NEXT NAMI MEETING
