Showcasing a woman in ministry comes easy, suggests Rev. Elizabeth Horton, pastor at First Reformed UCC in Lexington. Naming Rev. June Grubb, Associate Pastor of Congregational Care, Rev. Horton said, "She is a phenomenal minister in the ways of worship leadership and pastoral care, and through this pandemic, her ministry has continued to adapt and flourish in new ways."

The congregation holds high a number of her gifts, which include guiding of the AltarScape Team which is responsible for creating artistic worship displays for the different seasons of the liturgical year. As an educator, Grubb is also known for engaging members to think both theologically and artistically about scripture.

Her reach further includes a voice advocating for equity and justice in the community. Rev. #### DIRECTOR OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

First Reformed United Church of Christ, Lexington, NC

**Purpose of Position:** We seek a highly motivated, energetic leader who embraces the FRUCC Covenant to join our team as Director of Children and Youth Ministries. This position works collaboratively with the Board of Faith Formation teams for children and youth, as well as with the Pastor. Our worship is a hybrid of online and in person. Covid-safety guidelines are implemented and being followed. We are an Open and Affirming congregation in the UCC; all persons are welcome to apply. LGBTQ+ individuals and persons of color are encouraged and are celebrated.

Part-time: 15-20 hours per week, flexible hours; some weeks will be more intensive than others.

# **COMMUNITY GARDEN**

While Edgar Miller is recovering from surgery, I am pinch hitting as garden reporter.

I will take this opportunity to say thank you to Edgar for the 11 years of fresh produce that FRUCC's Community Garden has provided to the Lexington area. Edgar has done a tremendous job making sure the garden was growing in tip top shape. He has planted, weeded, tested, watered, harvested and delivered! And that doesn't begin to cover it all.

Today we give thanks for the growth that is happening in the garden right now.

Beginning in May, the church will have a Garden Coordinator, Becca Franklin. She will work 8-10 hours per week from May–October 2021. She will take the lead in organizing the logistics of planning and planting, to line up volunteers and coordinate ways for the garden to expand and deepen in ministry.

We are now partnering with Kidz Dreamz Club, an after school child care provider on East 1st Avenue (behind the Travel Center). Elementary and middle school children come and work in the garden, and it's a win for us all! They have already harvested kale, turnips and the other greens that wintered over. They

were very happy to take the fresh food home to their families. The possibilities are exciting as we think about our future together.

The money to sustain the garden has come from both individual and group donations, memorials, and grants. Currently, the only money from the church budget is for the utilities for the sprinkler system to irrigate.

The mission of the Garden Ministry continues to be getting fresh food into the hands and onto the plates of folks who need it.

#### **YOUTH NEWS**



# CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS...APRIL 2021

Consistory members met via Zoom on April 11, 2021.

#### **Board Reports**

#### Community Outreach (Robert Danze)

- Touching Davidson County with Love: Walter and Ann Hoffman will serve as committee chairpersons. Currently, this program is on hold.
- Community Garden: Edgar Miller will serve as chairperson.
- Clothing Closet (Jerry Lovell): Process going well in coordination with Open Hands and Saturday Take-out Lunch
- Charles England (Kathleen Danze): School has been contacted but needs have not been as much due to remote learning. This will change in the near future. We will be doing something for staff during Teacher Appreciation Week.
- Open Hands Ministry (John Maze): The Saturday Lunch Ministry continues to grow with an average served each at about 35. Another team of volunteers for the fourth Saturday of the month is needed.
- Shelter Meals: Women's Life Fellowship served approximately 50 in March. The next meal will be provided by the Adult Sunday school class along with the Morning Glory Circle.

#### **Board of Faith Formation**

#### (Alane Holste & Smithie Parrish)

 Review and revision of job description for a Faith Formation Director complete. As a parttime position, it should be for children and youth with some intergenerational activities. Adult Faith Formation can continue to be led by the adult team.

#### **Board of Worship and Sacrament**

#### (Kivi Miller & Lisa Nelson)

- Christopher Kiser accepted/hired as Organist/ Pianist and has been doing an excellent job since the middle of March.
- Attendance for Sunday, April 4, 2021: 88
- Kivi reported for the Digital Worship Committee that Jeremy Peterson volunteered to be the point person for live streaming technology and guide its evolution.

#### **Board of Property Management**

#### (John Smith & John Maze)

- A separate Wi-Fi connection was installed in the sanctuary.
- A toilet in the sanctuary was repaired by Alley Plumbing.

# Board of Business Management & Stewardship (Harriette Murphy)

- Average Weekly offering for March 2021: \$4,111 (\$5,889 needed to meet budget.)
- General Fund: \$19,765
- Music Fund: \$9,323

#### **Old Business**

**Board of Faith Formation:** A motion was approved that the position focus should be on children and youth. Rev. June Grubb will continue with the adult program.

**Pastoral Relations Board:** Will be filled by the fall. If discussions about relationships between the congregation and the pastor are needed, these will be addressed and not delayed.

#### **New Business**

**Board of Congregational Life:** The church's Spring Picnic at Wildcat Farm will be held on June 13<sup>th</sup>. This will be a full service with meal, music, and worship, with some changes that allow for Covid precautions.

**Digital Worship Committee:** Kivi Miller shared the need to purchase equipment for the church to continue streaming services, instead of depending on personal equipment currently being used. Funding for initial upgrade equipment was approved.

**Board of Community Outreach:** A new Blood Drive Coordinator is needed to serve as a liaison between the church and the Red Cross for our church's 2-3 blood drives a year.

Monday Night Meal Ministry: Open Hands Ministry has asked about starting this outreach program again. Consistory approved take out meals only with Covid precautions in place, but more information is needed before starting back up.

**Community Garden:** Volunteers for the Community Garden are needed. Edgar Miller would like to pay a garden coordinator as a long-term solution.

**Board of Worship and Sacrament:** New guidelines for the sanctuary flower calendar were suggested. This will now be handled by the church office. (see new guidelines on page 8.)

**Next Consistory Meeting:** A survey will be sent to Consistory members to decide if the next meeting will be virtual or in person. **The next Consistory meeting is May 16, 2021** 

# NEW GUIDELINES FOR PLACING FLOWERS IN CHURCH

#### **SPECIAL NOTE:**

It has been a tradition in our church to have flowers at the front of the sanctuary as a sign of creation and life. We encourage anyone who wishes to place flowers in honor or memory of someone to continue this tradition, however the guidelines for this ministry have changed.

- It will no longer be the church's responsibility to order and communicate information to the florist(s) for individuals wishing to place flowers in the church.
- Previously reserved dates will no longer be carried over from year to year.
- Sunday flower reservations will now be made through the church office based on a yearly calendar.
- In order to place flowers in the church, you must contact the church office either by phone or email to see if the requested week is open. (<u>carolyn@frucc.org</u> or 336-248-2617)
- Flowers will be placed at the front of the sanctuary unless someone has already reserved the date. Then, there will be an option to place flowers in the Narthex.

It will be up to individuals to provide the flowers and be responsible for all billing. There are only two florists in the area who have a key to the sanctuary for delivery of arrangements, C. Ray Floral Designs (336-247-1694) and Reggie's Flower Shoppe (336-731-8789). If you choose to use a different florist, you may contact the office to make plans for delivery. The church has several silk arrangements that may be used instead of ordering from a florist. These may be requested for use with a donation made to the church. The most appropriate seasonal arrangement will be selected from these.

It will be up to the individual to remove flowers from the sanctuary.

Make a sunflower, which turns its head to follow the sun.

### What you need:

- Paper plate
- Yellow marker
- Scissors
- Yarn (black and brown)

#### What you do:

- 1. Color the entire plate yellow.
- 2. Around the edge, cut out an odd number of triangles. Evenly space the cuts to form flower petals.
- 3. Poke a hole in the plate's center. String black yarn through the hole and over one triangle cut. Tie a knot at the back of the plate.
- 4. Continue looping yarn through the hole and over the remaining cuts. Secure the end. The flower should look like a wagon wheel with black spokes.
- 5. Tie the brown yarn to a black "spoke." Weave the brown yarn over and under the spokes in a circle.

  Continue until the sunflower has a large center.

  Then tie the end.
- 6. Display your craft as a reminder to follow the Son, Jesus!
