
Would you help our MOW recipients to continue receiving locally grown produce by sponsoring one week of Farm Share Delivery? The cost is \$50.00,

It has become increasingly clear to me that mental illness of varying degrees affects more families than I ever imagined right here in Davidson County.


Over the summer, we will read, <u>Blessed are the Crazy: Breaking the Silence about Mental Illness, Family, and Church</u>, by Sarah Griffith Lund.

<u>From the description</u>: When do you learn that "normal" doesn't include lots of yelling, lots of sleep-

ing, lots of beating? In this book, Sarah Griffith Lund looks back at her father's battle with bipolar disorder, and the helpless sense of déjà vu as her brother and cousin endure mental illness, as well. She seeks answers in her faith communities, from feeling pain in

God's presence, through seeing the Holy Spirit on Death Row as she witnesses her cousin's execution.

Sarah is a UCC minister serving as Minister for Disabilities and Mental Health Justice on the UCC national staff and as senior pastor of First Congregational UCC of Indianapolis, IN.







#### DIRECTIONS TO WILDCAT MOUNTAIN FARM: 10000 HWY 47, DENTON

- From the church, head North on North Salisbury Street
- Turn right at the stop sign onto East 5th Street (becomes Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard. then Raleigh Road, then Old Hwy 64 East)
- Travel 6.7 miles (staying straight through both stoplights you'll pass) and turn right onto Young Road
- Travel 1.9 miles and turn left onto Jerusalem
   Road (this will change to Regan Road)
- Travel 2.9 miles and turn right onto Frank Road
- Travel 1.8 miles and turn left at the stop sign onto Hwy 47 East
- Travel 0.6 miles to the entrance to Wildcat on the right
- The picnic area will be on the right, 3/4 mile down the drive

**Purpose of Position:** We seek a highly motivated, energetic leader who embraces the FRUCC Covenant to join our team as Director of Children and Youth Ministries. This position works collaboratively with the Board of Faith Formation teams for children and youth, as well as with the Pastor. Our worship is a hybrid of online and in person. The Clothes Closet continues to receive generous contributions from the community, for which we are very appreciative. We still, however, have a need for more men's clothing along with clothes for school-age boys and girls.

We are filling orders for our neighbors through collaborations with the Saturday Lunches served from First Reformed, the Monday, Wednesday, and Friday Breakfasts served by Open Hands at St. Stephen, and volunteers with Meals on Wheels.

Just this week, we met pastors from "Victory in Jesus Christ Ministries." Through our conversations, we learned that their primary mission is to offer "refuge and restora-

tion to those who are lost". They house, clothe, and feed men and women free of charge. Some of their clients had clothing needs they were unable to supply. Working with First's Clothes Closet, items were given to fill that gap. Assisting this ministry and their needs now, and possibly in the future, grows our ministry at First Reformed; a ministry that is expanding into neighboring communities.

#### **Board Reports:**

#### Community Outreach: Robert Danze

- Community Garden (Edgar Miller): Kidz Dreamz Klub continues to help in the garden.
- Charles England (Kathleen Danze): Teacher Appreciation Day snacks and special treats on May 6 were enjoyed and appreciated by all staff.
- Shelter Meals: Adult Sunday School and Morning Glory Circle provided money for the shelter to purchase pizza, drinks and dessert for the meal on May 10. Next served meal will be the provided by Nina Smith and the youth on September 13, 2021.

#### Congregational Life: Mike Price and Susie Smith

• Working on plans for June 13<sup>th</sup> picnic. Susie is organizing.

#### Evangelism: Renee White and Dave Fulton

Weekly Attendance Average for April 2021: 59.

#### Property Management: John Smith and John Maze

- Removed a beetle-infested tree from the Community Garden after part of it fell during a storm.
- Education Building chiller was cleaned so we could change over from heat to air.
- John Maze spoke with Alley Plumbing about a leak in the Education Building. Roughly 30-40' of cracked cast iron sanitary line in need of repair was replaced with PVC pipe.
- Paula spoke with Sharpe Co. about changing the sanctuary sign to read worship at 10:30am rather than 11:00am.
- The kitchen refrigerator stopped working. Necessary repairs were made.

#### **Business Management & Stewardship:**

- Average Weekly offering for April 2021: \$4,775 (Average weekly offering needed to meet the budget \$5,889)
- General Fund: \$15,403Music Fund: \$9,323

#### Concerns of the Past {Old Business}:

- Monday Night Meal Ministry was approved to restart with take-out service only.
- Faith Formation Search: Applications have begun to come in for the position of Director of Children and Youth Ministries. A search committee is being formed to interview possible candidates.
- Spring Picnic at Wildcat Farm on June 13<sup>th</sup>. Full service with basic and simplified meal, music and worship:

#### Concerns of the Future (New Business)

- **Board of Congregational Life:** Determining a timeline for small in-person groups to begin meeting using CDC guidelines:
  - a person who is vaccinated is not required to wear a mask indoors.
- Protocol during worship service remains in place.
  - Vaccinated persons may remove masks while seated.
  - No congregational singing.

This change will be in weekly email and announced by Rev. Horton from the pulpit. Small group meetings will be decided individually; will probably follow the same guidelines. Children will be required to wear masks inside and outside.

#### **Board of Community Outreach:**

- Garden Coordinator, Becca Franklin was hired to oversee the garden while Edgar Miller is recuperating, May—October 2021.
- Board of Community Outreach duties revised to replace those currently in the church manual.
- Kitchen Use for Saturday Carry-out Lunch Program was approved since the volume of food needing to be cooked has grown. The second, fourth, and occasional fifth Saturdays will use our kitchen facilities.
- New Blood Drive Coordinators: James and Alice Gray.

#### **Board of Worship and Sacrament:**

- New flower calendar protocol updated for the operating manual.
- Technical Update for Live Streaming Worship Services (Kivi Miller): The new equipment has been purchased and set in place. Jeremy Peterson said there are still some glitches to work out. A decision was made to use two cameras and live stream to YouTube (service can be downloaded to Facebook). Rev. Horton will communicate this message during the worship service.
- Kidz Dreamz Klub Proposal: A committee will be formed to meet with Kidz Dreamz Klub Director regarding a daycare for children ages 1-pre-K using our facilities. Committee should clarify expectations and responsibilities. More details are needed.
- Next Consistory Meeting: Decision will be made if next meeting will be in Person or via Zoom on: June 27, 2021



# My Angel

When we think of angels, we think of these mythical creatures that hover over this world. But, in scripture the angels are beings who have greater power and ability than humans. They exist in heaven or the spirit ram and they are referred to as spirits. Angels are there to warn, guide and -- yes -- bring good news. They are there also to guide

us to our God. Such is and has been the life of Janelle Bunn who on last Thursday subsumed to her illness that had hovered within her body over the last few years. I called Janelle my angel because it was Janelle who, upon my arrival to the Conference, guided me in the affairs of the Conference. She warned me of the pitfalls and dangers that were inherent in the Conference and she encouraged me and let me know God was with me. That is why I am here.

When I first came to the Southern Conference two songs stood out for me as I visited the various churches. They were "They'll know we are Christians by our Love" and in particularly in the African American Church, "I'm a soldier in the army of the Lord." These songs resonated in my spirit and they were often reminders of the Apostle Paul narrative of the 13 Corinthians when he said love is kind, love is patient. Janelle not only talked about love but she exemplified it. All too often she would correct me when I would think about the behaviors of others in the Conference by saying, "the best way to understand is to know no matter what position people have, the only thing that is going to define them is their behavior."

I often share with others that the people that I admire in history are Martin Luther King, Jr., Mother Teresa, Franklin Roosevelt, Nelson Mandela and Sojourner Truth, because they all possess the ability to love and show kindness to those who are suffering. They were each known for their strength and conviction, but they are also known for their love and kindness towards humanity.

This former English teacher was gifted in knowing the correct way to pronounce words as well as the right words to use in the structure of a sentence. However, she also understood the correct way to be in life. Most certainly there are those who do work for social justice, but have no love. There are those who are gifted in properly exegeting scriptures, but have no love. There are those who are intellectually gifted, but yet they have no love. In Paul's narrative of love, it reminds me of the soul singer James Brown saying, "you are just talking loud and saying nothing" as it pertains to love.

Janelle Bunn was genuine. The Apostle Paul reminds us in Romans to let our love be genuine and authentic. Janelle's love was authentic. How she demonstrated God's love was amazing. She showed to all of us that being kind is not a sign of weakness, because it takes just enough energy to be kind as it does to be rude. Over the years I have written several articles about kindness and I also asked for a period of kindness in the Conference in that we may move to a higher place in God. One of the most powerful stories in the bible was told of the Good Samaritan by Jesus. For any of you who have been to the Middle East and have experienced being on the Jericho Road, you could see how this road could cause complications for the traveler. At the heart of this narrative was the kindness and patience shown to a total stranger.

In seminary, I was taught by a professor that we are to be the physical representation of Christ for the people. This has stood with me since that time. I can truly say that Janelle Bunn was the physical representation of Christ among her family, friends, our staff and the people of the Southern Conference. Her ministry to God's people will not be defined by how many people she brought to the sanctuary but the life she lived, showing kindness and love to all.

She is missed, will be missed and will be forever in our hearts! Janelle Bunn, born December 15, 1938 and born into eternity May 21, 2021.

Farewell my angel! Well done!



## **Hear my Pastoral Words**

Family of the Southern Conference,






- Parchment paper
