On June 2, we held our first Zoom meeting about bringing to Lexington the support and resources of NAMI (National Association of Mental Illness).


It has become increasingly clear to me that mental illness of varying degrees affects more families than I ever imagined right here in Davidson County.

On Tuesday, August 24th at 7:00PM, we will discuss, <u>Blessed are the Crazy: Breaking the Silence about Mental Illness</u>, Family, and Church, by Sarah Griffith Lund.

From the description: When do you learn that "normal" doesn't include lots of yelling, lots of sleeping, lots of beating? In this book, Sarah Griffith Lund looks back at her father's battle with bipolar disorder, and the helpless sense of déjà vu as her brother and cousin endure mental illness, as

well. She seeks answers in her faith communities, from feeling pain in God's presence, through seeing the Holy Spirit on Death Row as she witnesses her cousin's execution.

Sarah is a UCC minister serving as Minister for Disabilities and Mental Health Justice on the UCC national staff and as senior pastor of First Congregational UCC of Indianapolis, IN.



A WEEK IN THE LIFE OF THE CLOTHES CLOSET

July 17, 2021

Our Clothing Ministry continues to expand due to the generosity of members of First Reformed and the community. The growing inventory has made it possible to assist in almost every situation that occurs. Over the past week we have been able to fill specific needs of people in the community.

After my morning walks, I check by Open Hands Ministry. There is almost always a new, urgent request. This week:

- A young woman needed a towel and washcloth so she could take a sponge bath at a public restroom, with permission. We helped.
- An older man needed shoes. (The ones he had on looked like the ones Tom Hanks wore in the movie, "Castaway".) He'd cut them out to fit. His feet were swollen and blistered. There was a pair that fit him. We helped.
- A young man needed a sleeping bag, but we didn't have any. He was given a blanket, and he was happy to get that. We helped. (IF you have any extra or unused sleeping bags, we need them.)
- Another man had gotten sick and soiled his clothes beyond any immediate washing. He was given a fresh pair of pants and shirt to get him through the rest of the day. We helped.
- A lady served by Meals on Wheels needed shoes and plus-size clothes that were easy for her to get on and off without assistance. We helped.

- Before our scheduled workday on Thursday, a young man was waiting for us to arrive. He'd just secured a job at a local fast food restaurant and needed dark pants and a pair of shoes to follow the dress code. He was able to get what he needed in order to report for work. We helped.
- The Mission Church in Concord is in contact weekly to get clothes for the men and women they serve in their ministry assisting folks to get back on their feet.
- We have been in contact with the new leaders of The Salvation Army in town.
 Their caseworker will be reaching out as needs arise.
- We have started to incorporate children from The Kidz Dreamz Klub downtown into the Clothes Ministry. An adult from there brings them from 1:30 to 2:30 on Thursdays. They work with direction from FRUCC Volunteers in helping to unpack and hang clothing.

These are the things that take place in an average week with the Clothing Ministry at FRUCC. Everyone is invited to drop by to see what the downstairs looks like now with this ever-growing service. Everyone is also invited to join us on the weekly workdays.

We thank you for allowing us to carry on this work at First Church. We appreciate your unceasing support.


Valarie Kaur, renowned Sikh activist, filmmaker, and civil rights lawyer, declares revolutionary love as the call of our time, a radical, joyful practice that extends in three directions: to others, to our opponents, and to ourselves. It invites us to see no stranger but instead look at others and say, "You are part of me I do not yet know."

Kaur takes us on her journey as a brown girl growing up in California farmland finding her place in the world:

- as a young adult galvanized by the murders of Sikhs after 9/11
- as a law student fighting injustices in American prisons
- and as a woman trying to heal from her own experiences with sexual assault and police violence.

"See No Stranger" helps us imagine new ways of being with each other, and with ourselves, so that together we can begin to build the world we want to see.








Prayer bracelet

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.



What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:


- 1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
- 2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
- 3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
 - **blue** = the Father
 - **white** = God's holiness
 - **gold** = God's kingdom
 - **green** = the earth
 - **yellow** = wheat (bread)
 - red = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
 - **black** = temptation
 - **orange** = God's power to deliver



Teach us to pray
