NEW SUNDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY SERIES

On Sunday August 29th a five-week Bible series, "Doers of the Word," began. to explore the New Testament Epistle of James.

The writer of James, thought to be the brother of Jesus, gives us a chance to reflect on the nature of Christian service and how we can continue our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world by engaging with our wider community in acts of service. One thing that is clear from current sociological research, is that while there are many who question the institution of the church, getting involved in providing real help to better our neighborhoods and to lift up the individuals and families within them, is an easy entry into the worship life of the church. James asks us to maintain an outward focus, even when we gather for worship.

Our Bible study group meets at 9:30AM in the parlor on Sunday mornings. We observe social distancing and wear masks in compliance with our congregation's COVID protocol. We invite

you to join our lively group as we engage with this epistle and seek to be doers of the world.


Valarie Kaur, renowned Sikh activist, filmmaker, and civil rights lawyer, declares revolutionary love as the call of our time, a radical, joyful practice that extends in three directions: to others, to our opponents, and to ourselves. It invites us to see no stranger but instead look at others and say, "You are part of me I do not yet know."

Kaur takes us on her journey as a brown girl growing up in California farmland finding her place in the world:

- as a young adult galvanized by the murders of Sikhs after 9/11
- as a law student fighting injustices in American prisons
- and as a woman trying to heal from her own experiences with sexual assault and police violence.

"See No Stranger" helps us imagine new ways of being with each other, and with ourselves, so that together we can begin to build the world we want to see.

- Saturdays 12:30 1:30pm when First Reformed serves Take-Out lunch

Thursdays 4 – 6:00pm are Clothes Closet workday hours. At this time, volunteers fill orders, sort and categorize clothes. (This is a great time to drop off donations! Use the basement door at the ramp beside of Domino's Pizza)

We witness so many "God Winks" or "God Moments."

- Having picked up an SUV full of clothes donated from a widow, a church member just "happened" to come by the church to drop off clothes, as well. Instant help unloading the SUV!
- This past month, a young lady placed clothing requests for her mother, her three

children, and herself while at Open Hands breakfast. On Wednesday she picked up the clothes and expressed gratitude. She opened the trunk to load up the clothes, but before she closed it, she proceeded to take out cans and boxes of food. She put these food items in the outdoor Food Box at St. Stephen UMC, saying she wanted to give something back to say thank you for what she had received.

When Jesus healed the ten lepers, only one returned to express his thankfulness for the miracle he had experienced. Thank you all for your unfailing support of this Clothing Ministry. Lives are being touched in this community.

OLD BUSINESS

- Faith Formation Search: Search Committee recommended Rev. Evan Sieges for the part-time position of Director of Children and Youth Ministries. (15 hours a week)
- Community Outreach: Donations for Backpack Program at Charles England will be advertised as an ongoing program.

NEW BUSINESS

Board of Property Management:

- Board has met with the Parlor Committee about updating the church parlor to be completed in two phases. Plans and costs were approved by Consistory to be presented to the Trustees for approval.
- The board asked for permission to remove excess/unused items from the basement. The office will advertise so any personal items may be removed prior to cleaning.
- Our fire inspection was on 8/4/2021 and the partial pews were cited in the church stairway as an issue. Those need to be disposed of if no one has use for the wood. The Consistory went downstairs to view current conditions before approving the clean up.
- The board received permission to replace the small window AC unit in the classroom next to the Chapel Annex to allow Chris to have piano lessons in that room without the need to heat or cool the whole building.

COVID Protocol Updates:

• We will return to masks full-time while inside. There will continue to be no congregational singing. Ellen will meet with the choir and discuss options. The revisions to the policy will be implemented immediately to ensure the safety and well-being of the body of the church. Information will Attendance will continue to be kept, but we will no longer take temperatures. Masks will be provided if anyone doesn't have one. Liturgists and pastors do not have to wear masks at the pulpit if they are vaccinated. If they are not vaccinated, masks will be worn as they serve as liturgist. The same will be true with choir members. Ellen will discuss with choir.

UPDATE ON MENTAL ILLNESS CLOSE TO HOME



Over the past several months, a small group of First Reformers and others from the community have met over Zoom with the sole purpose of seeking to bring more support and resources for families living with Mental Illness. Thanks to the heart, courage, and passion of **Joe and Cathy Browder**, Davidson County folks will soon be able to receive locally the resources of National Alliance for Mental Illness (NAMI).

Rather than creating its own chapter, Davidson County will join the existing **NW Piedmont NAMI** that currently serves Forsyth, Davie and Stokes Counties.

The first support meeting that will be offered in Lexington is Family Support Group. (FSG). These are meetings of family members, caregivers, friends, and loved ones of individuals living with mental illness. Participants can talk frankly about their challenges and help one another through their learned wisdom.

Each support group needs TWO facilitators. We

hope to begin holding meetings at FRUCC in May 2022. Until we have our own meetings, NAMI NW Piedmont has invited us to attend their Family and Connection/Recovery Support Groups which are held via Zoom.

If you are interested in attending a Family support group please contact Cathy Browder or the church office. You can also go to https://naminc.org/programs/ to learn more.

We will continue at First Reformed to discern ways to minister to families and individuals living with Mental Illness, such as in our studies, prayers, worship, speakers, groups and public advocacy. The majority of people either know someone or have themselves been diagnosed with mental illness. Of utmost importance is to create a community where we can be authentic and unafraid with one another.

Pray for those with mental illness and their loved ones.






Jesus tells a parable about faithful servants who multiply their master's money. How does the master respond?



What you need:

- Construction paper (2 sheets)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Glue
- Gold crayon or pen
- Black pen

What you do:

- 1. Fold one sheet of paper in half lengthwise. Trace your hand and lower arm so your arm touches the folded edge. Cut out the arm and hand, keeping the folded edge uncut.
- 2. Glue the folded hand to the other sheet of paper.
- 3. In gold, draw five coins in the hand. In black, write the skills and gifts God has given you.
- 4. Open the fold and draw 10 gold coins in the two open hands. In black, write how you can use your skills and gifts to help others and honor God.
