In just a few weeks, families living with mental illness in Davidson County can access local support in NAMI services!

Beginning in April, on the 1st and 3rd Mondays at 7:00PM, Cathy Browder will co-facilitate a **Family Support Group via Zoom**. This is a meeting where people can talk to each other about experiences with a loved one afflicted by a mental health condition.

When COVID restrictions are lifted, meetings will be held in person at First Reformed United Church of Christ (FRUCC) at 104 E Center Street, Lexington.

Thanks to the efforts of Cathy and Joe Browder, Davidson County is now partnering with the larger N.W. NAMI which already serves Forsyth, Davie, and Stokes Counties. With this partnership, now, instead of having to go to Winston-Salem or Greensboro for mental health support services, many will now have the ability to remain in their home county.

Cathy represents Davidson County on the N.W. NAMI board, and now Davidson County has been given full access to their services.

"The mission of NAMI North Carolina is to provide support, education, advocacy, and public awareness so that all affected by mental illness can build better lives."



It was fun to work with folks we haven't been able to enjoy in the past, as well as our regularly committed volunteers.

Thanks to the congregation for bringing in so many potatoes, mac and cheese, green bean casseroles, deviled eggs, Jell-o salads, pies, cakes and cookies! One thing I knew for sure, was our congregation would come through with enormous amounts of food because our congregation cares! A special thanks goes to Jerry Lovell for bringing the meat slicer to cut up the dozen hams. We had a perfect count for what we needed to serve! We were able to offer heaping amounts of food to those who came to eat. Many of our friends had seconds and thirds! The Christmas meal ended up serving 93 people! 93 people got to eat on Christmas Day instead of going hungry. Think about that! It filled my heart to see everyone give up their time on Christmas and work on putting together a great meal!

We are changing the expectations in the city of Lexington for ensuring our homeless and less fortunate are being fed all days of the week. Their thanks and continuous comments on such great homemade food made it so well worth it! Many of our homeless friends stayed and helped break down the tables showing their appreciation! HAPPY ANNIVERSARY, SATURDAY LUNCH MINISTRY!

On **February 20th**, the SATURDAY TAKE-OUT LUNCH MINISTRY celebrates it's First Anniversary. Very quickly, this ministry proved to be a successful outreach program!

John Maze shares how this ministry began...

"In the beginning, a former board member of Open Hands and volunteer, Kathy Frangos, brainstormed with me on what was needed in the community. She brought forth the suggestion of a Saturday meal, as that was the one day of the week a hot meal was not available for those who needed one. From there, she and Helen Cheramie (both of Macedonia Methodist) helped put this program together, as it was new territory for me. Without them, I am afraid I would not have launched this program very well. They are creative and very resourceful, which helped me enormously. They have branched out and created a breakfast program three days a week at Macedonia, as well as two nightly meals, which have taken off much like our lunch program.

"They have helped me find resources and people to get the food we need without spending excessive amounts of money. Most importantly, they have taught me indirectly, that we all need to work together to make sure the homeless and less fortunate are fed. Saturday Lunch works indirectly with four different food ministries, and we all try to share resources and labor as much as possible.

"Kathy, Helen and I worked together to make it happen. They deserve a ton of credit along with all who help make it happen each week."

During worship service on February 20th, we will celebrate this ministry's successful first year. Thank you, John Maze, for your part in getting this outreach program started and following through weekly with your work to get volunteers and food so this ministry continued each week to its first anniversary. Thank you to all the volunteers who self-lessly give their time to volunteer to help serve and provide food for all who come.

Once again, through the generosity of our Church Family, there were approximately 175 packages put together...almost double the number we'd planned.

Over Thanksgiving, our oldest granddaughter said something that has been resounding in my head and heart. In her infinite ten-year-old wisdom, while talking about holidays in general, she said that most holidays are just days; but that Christmas is a season of love that should be shared throughout the year.

So, Christmas Day 2021 has passed. Let's keep the season of love alive in 2022. **We are the Church!**

CRUCIAL CONVERSATIONS ON FAITH AND RACE

(2CFAR)



2CFAR, during Covid-19, is a virtual community designed for intentional and honest conversations to help foster racial justice and reconciliation in our Community. We meet Tuesdays at noon via

Zoom. We may have a local person share their own experiences with race and faith, or we may have open discussion amongst ourselves.

The group's foundation was formed through First Reformed's Board of Evangelism, under the leadership of Dave Fulton. In 2017, a small group from 2 black and 2 white churches (First Reformed, Second Reformed, St. Stephen UMC and Shadyside Presbyterian) sought out ways to do ministry together in what was then the East Lexington Collaborative Ministries.

It has been amazing to see how the Spirit has moved beyond the confines of 4 churches, involving folks from many cross sections of this community. Please contact the church office for the Zoom link.

One of the most segregated hours in Lexington (and most anywhere in the USA) is the Sunday morning service hour. 2CFAR is interested in exploring this segregation by making an effort

to attend, watch and/or participate in a morning worship experience, on each of the **5th Sundays** in the calendar year.

The challenge: Get outside of your comfort zone in religion on Sunday morning....actually, you can watch a recorded service to meet this challenge.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO PLACE FLOWERS IN THE CHURCH?

It has been a tradition in our church to have flowers at the front of the sanctuary as a sign of creation and life. We encourage anyone who wishes to place flowers in honor or memory of someone to continue this tradition, however the guidelines for this ministry changed in 2021.

- It is no longer be the church's responsibility to order and communicate information to the florist for individuals wishing to place flowers in the church.
- Previously reserved dates are no longer carried over from year to year.
- Sunday flower reservations are now be made through the church office based on a yearly calendar.
- Flowers will be placed at the front of the sanctuary unless someone has already reserved the date. Then there is an option to place flowers in the Narthex.
- In order to place flowers in the church, you must contact the church office either by phone or email to see if the requested week is open. (<u>carolyn@frucc.org</u> or 336-248-2617)

It will be up to individuals to provide the flowers and be responsible for all billing. There are only two florists in the area who have a key to the sanctuary for delivery of arrangements, **C Ray Floral Designs (336-247-1694)** and **Reggie's Flower Shoppe (336-731-8789)**. If you choose to use a different florist, you may contact the office to arrange for delivery or bring the arrangement yourself to the sanctuary on Sunday morning prior to worship.

The church has several silk arrangements that may be used instead of ordering from a florist. These may be requested for use with a donation made to the church. The most appropriate seasonal arrangement will be selected from these.

It will be up to the individual to make arrangements for removal of flowers from the sanctuary.

A calendar for each new year will be available for reservations by December 1 of the current year.


