A MESSAGE FROM REV. HORTON

On February 20, I attended the farewell and closing service of First United Church of Christ in WINSTON-SALEM, where I served as pastor for nine and a half years.

I was filled with many emotions across the spectrum: loss, grief, sadness, anger, fear, but mainly disbelief. I never really thought churches like that, especially one of which I was a part, could close. One of the most sobering moments was the processional hymn the organ belted out while former pastors and the entire congregation stood and sang. "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee"...it just felt wrong to sing about joy when a church just died.

But apparently, the Holy Spirit began to unlock my own spirit, and I found myself surprised by feelings of gratitude and, perhaps, a bit of joy. While preachers were plentiful for this church funeral, the music of the service really carried the message. We also sang "Amazing Grace," "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" (the first hymn sung in 1905), and ended with "Great Is Thy Faithfulness." Joy, grace, relationship, and God's eternal presence...is there anything else that sustains us?

Indeed, First UCC was a sacred place because people experienced God there. Even though the church is no more, God has not left. God is still very present in that space...a place that will once again experience a resurrection. We serve a God who is not bound by our expectations, but a God who relishes in bringing forth new life.

On March 2, Lent begins. This year let's focus not on a Lenten journey, but let us explore the very place where we stand, our location, our spot in the world. This Lent let us explore what it means to proclaim that God is present, no matter where we are, even if it is in the shadows of death. Let us dive deeply into the proclamation that God can find you no matter where you are. Any place can be a place for resurrection.



Finance & Budget Report for January 2022

Average weekly offering deposited in January 2022: **\$3,489** (Average weekly offering needed to meet the budget: **\$5,889**) Donation decreases were due to inclement weather.

Elon Home/Schools are no longer in operation. Consistory approved move money allocated for this benevolence to the Saturday Lunch Ministry to help offset costs.

Pastor's Report for January

Rev. Elizabeth Horton Rev. Horton shared that It has been a transformational year and would like for the Consistory to focus on the following questions:

What are our ministries?

How does our structure support these ministries?

How do we connect, engage and equip each?

Old Business

Setting Up Boards:

- All board chairs were reminded to set up committees for their boards ASAP. All members added should confirm they are willing to serve.
- Jeremy Lovell will chair the Board of Congregational Life.
- Boards may need to revise duties currently listed in the church manual to determine if they meet current needs.
- The Pastoral Relations Committee, set up to support and strengthen the relationship between the pastor and congregation, is now chaired by Kivi Miller. Kivi asked Eddie Yates, Doris Sink, Keri Lovell and Billy West to serve on

the committee of five people, who will serve two-year terms on a rotational basis with a few leaving as new members are added. Members were approved by Consistory via e-vote.

Review Covid Protocols:

Current policy for Covid protocols were re viewed. Masks are still required, and a sign is needed outside the sanctuary that states this. John Gray will contact the Community Health Director for recommendations regarding contact tracing and small group gatherings. Changes in the protocol will be reviewed at the next meeting.

Update on Second Harvest Food Bank & Saturday Lunch Ministry

- Supplies for Saturday Lunch Ministry need to be moved on-site. A space at church for dry storage, refrigerator and freezer will be found.
- A Second Harvest Food Bank Application and arrangements for an on-site visit, which is required to partner with Second Harvest, will be completed by the Board of Property Management.
- All Saturday lunches will now be served at FRUCC.

New Business

• Board of Elections request for use of our church as voting site:

The Board of Election's request to use our church as a voting place was approved.

• Personnel Change:

Carolyn Robbins will retire as Administrative Assistant, effective April 30, 2022. She will be available to help new staff with the transition. The Financial Administrator and Administrative Assistant will be combined as one full-time job.

• Upcoming Fundraiser:

John Maze called attention to an upcoming fundraiser at the Civic Center planned by PFLAG and Lexington Live. In order for to network community events, the fundraiser will be advertised on the church website.

• February 13 Congregational Meeting: Time of Connecting:

PASTORAL RELATIONS BEGINS MEETING IN MARCH Kivi Miller, Chairperson

In the UCC tradition, the Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC) plays an important role in supporting a healthy relationship between the pastor and congregants in order to promote a healthy, faithful, and shared ministry. It does this in two primary ways:

- (1) by serving as an advisory group to the minister, sharing ideas, dreams, expectations, and concerns of the congregation with the pastor
- (2) serving as a support group for the pastor's leadership, interpreting roles, functions, boundaries, opportunities, and needs of the pastor to the congregation.

PRCs are meant to help the minister and the congregation maintain appropriate expectations for the scope of the minister's work, and for the pastor to be able to test visions and receive support for their continued growth in ministry.

With the blessing of the Consistory and Pastor Elizabeth, the following members will serve on the PRC this year, meeting once a month, starting in March:

- Billy West (2-year term)
- Eddie Yates (1-year term)
- Doris Sink (1-year term)

When PRCs work well, they promote honest communication, provide robust support and advocacy for the pastor, create confidential spaces for clear communication, and provide opportunities for the minister and the committee to reflect on their ministry. They are not meant to be channels for anonymous complaints or to circumvent church decision-making processes, such as the Consistory or boards.

Please feel free to contact any PRC member with your ideas, dreams, expectations, and concerns. You should also feel free, as always, to share the same directly with Pastor Elizabeth and Consistory members, as well.

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 3rd. The season is both rich and scary. Rich because we are invited to dig deep into our faith practices and determine if we are on the right path to becoming disciples of Jesus Christ. We are encouraged to look at our whole lives and then lay them alongside of the life of Christ and see how we measure up. That is where the scary part comes in.

Being honest with ourselves is a difficult exercise; that's part of why we need forty days to do it. It takes diligence and discipline and a whole lot of grace to see ourselves as we truly are.


