As we enter July, we long for a carefree summer, yet we know life is incredibly difficult for many in this season. We feel "on edge" wondering what will happen next…with our health, our job, our family, our government, our community, our church, and even our Faith.

We often assume that when our faith is on edge, we have waivered or fallen short. This is incorrect.

Throughout Scripture, we see our ancestors struggle with seasons of doubt, endure long nights when Fear, anger, and loss of hope take over.

On the Edge is our July sermon series on 3 prophets: Elisha, Amos, Hosea. The prophets show us that a life of faith is a life lived on the edge, always a bit out of place. They speak the uncomfortable truths we don't like to hear, which in turn, puts most folks on edge.





Consistory Highlights - June 2022

The Consistory met on Sunday, June 5, 2022.

Concerns of the Past: Interfaith Power & Light Review of Recommendations:

- Raise temp 1 degree in the summer and lower temp by 1 degree in winter in sanctuary to save 3% on power.
- Replace fluorescent lights with LED bulbs.
- Programmable thermostats in different zones of both buildings.
- Solutions for HVAC problems in Education Building: John Roberts, Interfaith Power, met with Nathan Kuykendall to work on a plan.

Approval to *prioritize pricing LED bulbs to replace fluorescent lights and programmable thermostats in sanctuary, fellowship hall and office.*

- John Maze stated the chiller needs to be changed out. The plan for HVAC solutions in Education Building is outlined in revised report from John Roberts. When Chiller goes down, replace the central system with individual units for each floor. It was advised to turnoff air unit in Chapel when not in use.
- John Maze is still getting information and pricing for ADA compliance restrooms.

Concern of the Future:

- John Gray stated two challenges: (1) need significant capital improvements and (2) we have a budget and offerings that show concerns
- John Gray stated that with no meeting in July, we may need a called meeting or Executive Board meeting.
- Rev. Horton shared that in strategizing ways to reconnect and reengage, she proposed new Framework for board meetings: Big Board Sunday starting September 18th. One Sunday per month all boards will meet after worship service. Children's activities and food will be provided. Each board will meet in separate areas in order to connect and create new ideas; standardize a time for boards to meet. She asked us to try this for 6 months.
- Jeremy Lovell shared idea of Boards' Fair in fellowship hall with information and visuals about the ministries of the boards.
- John Gray stated we need a motion to approve Big Board Sunday concept with steps of brainstorming, planning, holding a fair, and evaluating result.Motion was approved for Big Board Sunday, Sept. 18th
