

Symbolism of the Juneteenth Flag: The white star and surrounding star-burst is representative of Texas and the "freedom of African Americans in all 50 states". The outline around the star symbolizes a nova, or new star, representative of a new beginning. The date June 19, 1865 is the announcement in Texas that slavery was dead per General Order No. 3. Slaves had been freed two years earlier with the Emancipation Proclamation, but the slaves in Texas did not get the news. In 1866, freed slaves in Texas celebrated the first Juneteenth on June 19, and it was called "Jubilee Day".
