We finish our Sunday series, Unraveled, by exploring moments in the life of Job, and Moses when life begins to unravel; pivotal moments when they spiral downward. And this is just when God meets them, unravels their plans, and begins to create something new. They discover their undoing is not the end they fear it might be.

During this new year, our congregation has felt some Unravelings of our own: in our rhythms and rituals, board structures and meetings, attendance and communication, building needs, children and youth ministry, just to name a few. These unravelings can feel frustrating and unnerving.

Thank You, John Maze Saturday Lunch Ministry Celebrates its Second Full Year! Thanks to all of our volunteers that have made serving our community so successful for another year! February 13th will mark our second year of serving our friends in the city of Lexington and Davidson county. We average 86 people served each week with well over 4000 people fed each year. Please consider donating to a worthy ministry as food costs continue to soar. As an example, when the program started, hot dog buns and hamburger buns were 58 cents a package. Now the same buns run \$1.39. While it is frustrating to run a budget on soaring grocery hikes, we make it work. Together our volunteers make a difference in our community and serve healthy meals every Saturday.

I want to thank all of our volunteers from the bottom of my heart that have stepped up to cook as my new job landed me working many Saturdays. I lost a lot of sleep worrying over the lunch ministry and prayed hard for answers. Smithie Parish, Ben Hale, Cindy Easter, Stacy Sosebee-West, and our friends Helen and Kathy at Macedonia Methodist all helped to cook meals that served so many! Ben and Stacy's meal they created, tacos, have taken the number one spot in the number of people served on any Saturday! Thank you!

Thanks to ALL of our wonderful volunteers that work many Saturdays to ensure our ministry serves the people that need us most! We are coming up to our second-year anniversary of this ministry in the community.


